MINERS WIN STRIKE.

The anthracite coal operators have offered the striking miners an advance of 10 per cent, on condition they return to work at once, and it is said a rebate on powder of 121/2 cents may also be proposed. The move was decided on at a meeting held in New York Thursday, but, as the union was ignored, President Mitchell still talks fight. Whether the men themselves will stand firm is another question. The strike leaders say the 130,000 men will not go back to work till they go as union. The operators declare the strikers have secured what they desired and that the collieries will be in


