

Society Provides Marriage Dowries. Paris has a novel provident society, intended to provide marriage dowries for all its members of both sexes. Monthly payments of 10 cents for ten years insures a "dot" at marriage after that time of \$75. Larger payments bring a corresponding increase of dowry. The grants, of course, are considerably in excess of the sums of the premiums accumulated at compound interest, the difference being made up out of the society's funds, derived from patrons' subscriptions, donations and legacies. The institution, founded in 1895, has prospered wonderfully, having a membership roll of girls and young men of 162,000. The present year of grace, being the fifth of the society's existence, has witnessed several departures from the association, members having claimed their dowries at the expiration of the prescribed time, and got married at once on the strength of them, frequently to other recipients of similar portions from the "Donation," as the society is called.




