Messrs. Payne (Rep., N. Y.), Grosvenor (Rep., Ohio), and Richardson (Dem., Tenn.), were appointed to join the committee of the senate to notify the president that congress was in session and ready to receive any communication from him. The president's message was laid before the house at 2 p. m. and its reading occupied two hours and ten minutes.

Aside from the reading of the message and the administration of the oath of office to William B. Dillingham, the new senator from Vermont, who succeeds the late Justin S. Morrill, no business was transacted in the

SEVEN DIE AMID RUINS.

Chicago.

Seven persons were killed and sixteen others were more or less seriously injured as a result of the explosion of one of the large steam boilers in the power-house of the Chicago and Northwestern railway at Chicago Monday evening. By half a second's timethe interval between the passage of the Milwaukee flyer by the powerhouse and the moment the boiler weighing several tons was projected across the track—the passenger train escaped wreck. The engineer, putting on the maximum speecd, averted impending disaster, but the bulky metal missive struck the last coach and carried away the roof. The force of the explosion wrecked the building beyond repair and for several hours the Northwestern depot was in darkness and thousands of lives were endangered by the disabling of the interlock ing switches of the railroad, which are operated by electricity furnished by the power-house. The loss involved was approximately \$50,000.

Panther Devours a Child. An 8-year-old daughter of C. P. Riley, a farmer living about sixteen miles from Cartwright, Wis., in the Mad Brook settlement, was carried away by a panther and devoured. Only a few fragments of the remains could be found. The girl was walking in the road near the farm, when the beast sprang from the woods, and, taking the girl in his jaws, carried her into a swamp, where she met a hor-The few scatteredSHRDLUU death, being torn limb from limb. The few scattered remains were gathered up and buried. The community has organized in a panther hunt, and the farmers will not lay aside their guns until the brutes are exterminated. Since they started out a panther measuring ten feet from tip to tip has been shot, and two other large ones have been seen.

Diaz Takes Oath of Office. President Diaz, escorted by his miltary staff and presidential guards, Saturday passed through streets lined with troops to the hall of the house of representatives, where he took the oath as president of the republic for the next four years. The president then drove with his staff and escort, accompanied by all his cabinet ministers, to the national palace, where he received the congratulations of the diplomatic corps.

Three masked burglars entered the house of James Graham, two miles east of Stanton, Mich., bound Mr. and Mrs. Graham fast to their bed with ropes and ransacked the house, securing \$28 in cash and a gold watch and other articles. The burglars then hitched up one of Graham's horses and left. About ten minutes after they left Graham freed himself, but never gave the

Thirty Coal Boats Are Sunk. The steamers Tom Dodsworth and Volunteer, both Pittsburg towboats, collided twenty miles above Huntington. Almost thirty coal boats, containing 600,000 bushels of coal, sank. The loss is \$100,000. Both the steamers and coal are owned by the Pittsburg coal combine,


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
