Dietrich smiled sadly at his friend, and, lamenting the poverty of the fare he had to offer, declared he would sacrifice the last semaining bottle of Rhine wine in his cellar if he thought it would aid De Lisie's poetic invention and inspire him to compose a patriotic song for the public ceremonies shortly to take place in Strasburg. The ladies approved, and sent for the last bottle of wine which the house could boast.

"After dinner De Lisle sought his rocan, and, though it was bitterly cold, he at once sat down at the plane, and, between reciting and playing and singing, eventually composed "La Marselllaise," and thoroughly exhausted, fell asleep with his head on his desk.
