The commencement of charges will at once follow, being 15 cents I ad r mare placed him in a post- for each lot, and 25 cents for each tract o Three weeks before the June term of the county court, the treasurer applies to the county court for a judgement against the unpaid taxes. The court sets the day of sale, usually the second Monday after judgement is given. The treasurer keeps the books until the day of sale, when they are turned over to the county clerk, who conducts the sale. At this time costs multiply rapidly, treasurer's and clerk's costs aggregating 51 cents for each lot and 70 cents for each tract. At the sale a penalty not exceeding 25 per cent is imposed. secording to the bids of the buyers, wh pay all accuraulated costs. To redeem the 1750 property the delinquent must then pay total costs and penalty within six months, after which the penalty is doubled and continues to increase each succeeding six months. Redemption must be made within two years or a tax title is issued to
