The following communication and request of County Superintendent Morgan was, on motion of Supervisor Hammer-schmidt, approved and granted.

WHEREAS, the forty-second General Assembly of the state of Illinois has passed an "Act to provide for numbering consecutively all school districts in each county in the state, and for numbering school districts which lie in two or more counties."

WHEREAS, the law requires the county superintendent of schools shall prepare a map of his county on a scale not less than two inches to the mile.
