It is reasonable to presume that before many seasons an electric railroad will conmeet Aurora and Chicago along the line of the northern part of the county is nearing completion. The Joliet road is in operation and the rich country bereabouts offers an inviting field to promoters and interurban trolley lines. If Downers Grove done not wish to be passed by in the allotment of good things it is time her people realized the importance of encouraging whatever may be for the advancement of the towns material progress. There is little doubt that a few years will witness an extension of trolley lines throughout DuPage county. If Downers Grove is to be en the line of one of these roads some effort should be made to secure it when opportunity offers. This can be best complished by granting franchises on the most liberal terms compatible with the welfare of the village interests. No doubts that sooner or later a franchise will be saked. That it should be granted on liberal terms goes without saying. The ingrease in the number of visitors to this village in the event of the establishment of trolley lines north and south, and east and west would be enermous. They cre ste a traffic of their own that never before existed. Farmers and residents who come to Downers Grove are now compelled to drive, but with hourly service on the trolley lines could come and go at their pleasure, and make the round trip in an hour eree. It is because of these convenients that the trolley lines increase epormously the amount of travel, and their advent will augment very largely the number of daily visitors to this village and the amounts expended with its business men. No other agency could contribute more substantially to the upbuilding and general prosperity of the village than the installation of a trolley line east and west in conjunction with one south-east from Wheaton connecting with the Jolliet road soath of Downers Grove.
