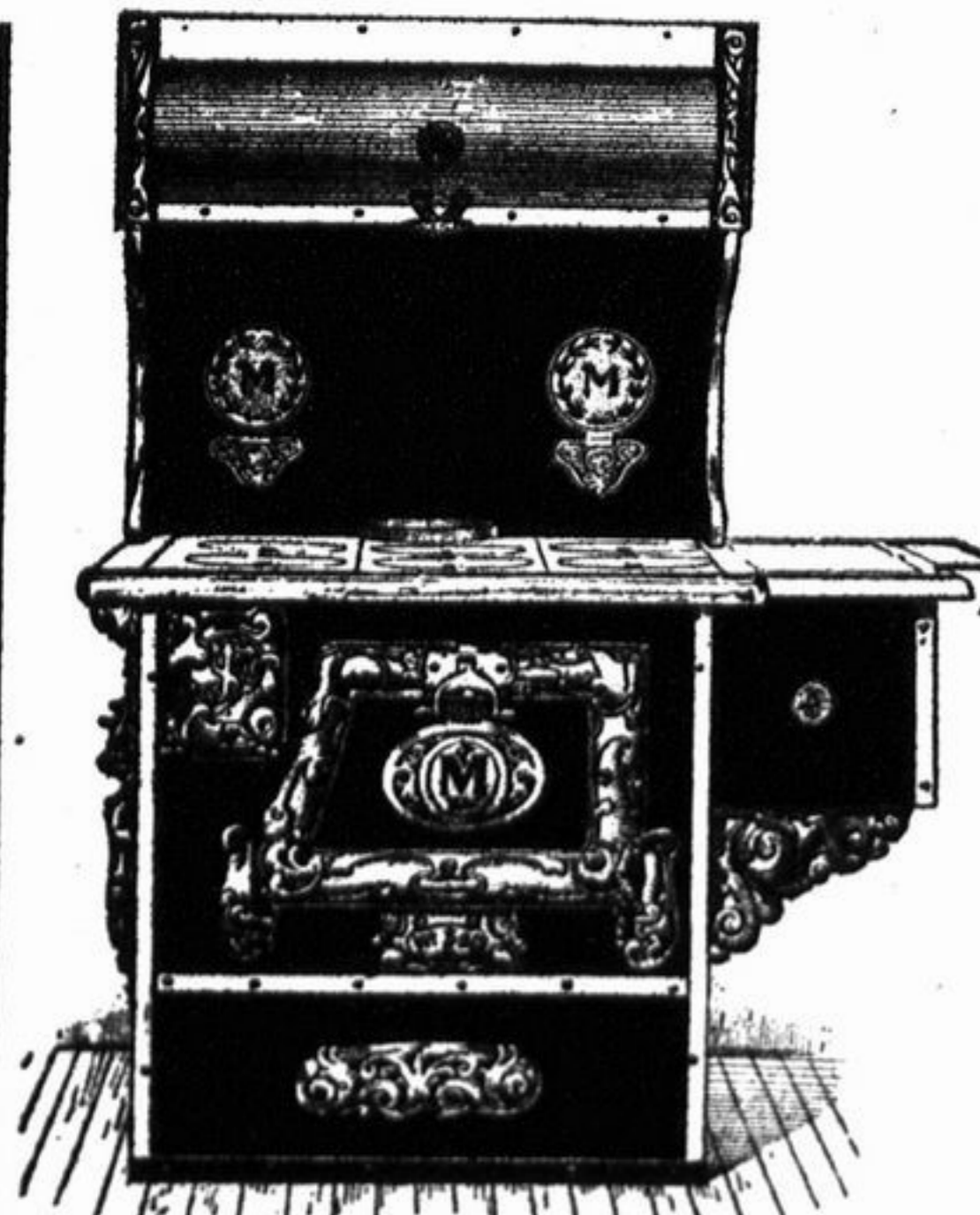

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WATER METER ORDINANCE.

Continued from the first page.

consumer at his own expense, provided however, no water meter shall be so connected until the same has been tested by the superintendent of water works, and a permit has been granted by him.

Water meters will be furnished by the village of Downers Grove at actual cost or application to the village collector. The water will be shut off from all consumers who have not placed the water meter on their service in accordance with this ordinance prior to May 1st, A. D. 1902, and the water will not be turned on again until the provisions of this ordinance have been complied with.

Sec. 11. All water meters must be placed by licensed plumbers, the plumber doing the work must flush the pipe thoroughly before connecting the meter. The connecting pipes of meters shall be joined with square faced unions, or flanges, and a full roadway stop and waste cock or gate valve, with waste inserted so as to conveniently provide for draining pipes and meters for repairs in freezing weather and emergencies. The shut off must be as low as the meter connection. Red or white lead must not be used by plumbers in connecting water meters.

Sec. 12. When water meters are set in basements they must be placed at least six inches distance from the wall and made secure from frost. When necessary to place water meters in a pit, the pit shall be constructed under the supervision of the superintendent of water works, provided, however, that no pit shall be less than 2 feet, 8 inches square inside measurement, and not less than five feet deep, constructed of either brick or two inch sound plank, with close fitting covers and curbs, and conveniently located for access. The pit must also be constructed in such a manner as to avoid surface water from covering the meter.

Sec. 13. All owners or operators of vehicles, wagons or carts, used for the purpose of street sprinkling, shall pay in addition to the license mentioned in Rule 19 of section 14 of this ordinance, the following rates of water used from the village hydrants, to-wit:

The sum of five dollars per month for the so-called business streets of said village described as follows: All of Main street from the intersection of Maple avenue, north to Warren avenue, thence west on said Warren avenue to Foote street; thence north on Foote street a distance of about two hundred feet.

For any additional streets or portions thereof the charge shall be at the rate of one dollar per month for each and every six hundred feet over and above the portion before mentioned as business streets.

Sec. 14. The following rules and regulations for the government of the water consumers, licensed plumbers, and for the performance of all work connected with the water system, are hereby adopted and established.

Rule 1. All work done in the streets of said village and contemplated under this ordinance must be done under the supervision of the superintendent of water works and subject to his direction and approval.

Rule 2. That no tap shall be inserted in, and that no service pipe shall be connected with, any distributing pipe or water main without a proper permit from the village collector as mentioned in Section 6 of this ordinance.

Rule 3. The following sums must be paid in advance by all applicants for water for the insertion of service cocks to-wit: For a house of nine rooms or less, the size of the service cock inserted shall be three-fourths of an inch, for which the cost shall be twelve dollars.

For a house of ten and not to exceed fifteen rooms, the size of the service cock inserted shall be one inch, for which the cost shall be fifteen dollars. No larger service cock will be inserted without special permit from the board of trustees.

The above mentioned sum shall include the furnishing by the village of the service cock and valve, the cast iron service box and stop-cock, the necessary pipe connecting with the same to point to be established between the curb line and the sidewalk, and the cost of excavating and filling the trenches.

Rule 4. All service pipes connections of less than two inches in diameter shall be made of lead pipe. All connections for household purposes shall be made of best galvanized iron, or "strong lead" pipe, weighing four pounds to the linear foot.

Rule 5. The service pipe shall in all cases have sufficient length to prevent fractures of same from settlement of earth, and before the connection is made, the earth must be carefully rammed under and around the distributing and service pipes to a level with the top of same.

Rule 6. Each service pipe shall be placed at a right angle with the water main and in all cases be laid not less than five feet below the established grade of the street in which it is placed without regard to the depth of the street main.

Each pipe must also have its independent tap, together with a stop-cock and cast iron shut off box, the latter of which shall be five feet in length. The shut off box shall always be set plumb and in a substantial manner, and located within the curb line.

Rule 7. All service cocks or ferrules must be inserted at or near the top of street mains, and not in any case near or than eighteen inches to the bell of the pipe. The size of the service cock to be inserted shall be only that specified in the permit. Every stop cock, shut off box and tap shall be furnished by the said village.

Rule 8. No person except the superintendent of water works, duly authorized by the board of trustees, will be permitted to tap the street mains or insert stop cocks or ferrules therein. Neither shall any person other than said superintendent of water works, or his representatives, turn on or on any water supply, nor shall they do so until so ordered by the village collector.

Rule 9. The sidewalk stop cock shall be one inch round way, and shall be located directly opposite the tap in the street main. The top of the stop box shall in all cases remain uncovered and be placed twenty feet from the center line of the street, and on a level with the surface of the ground.
