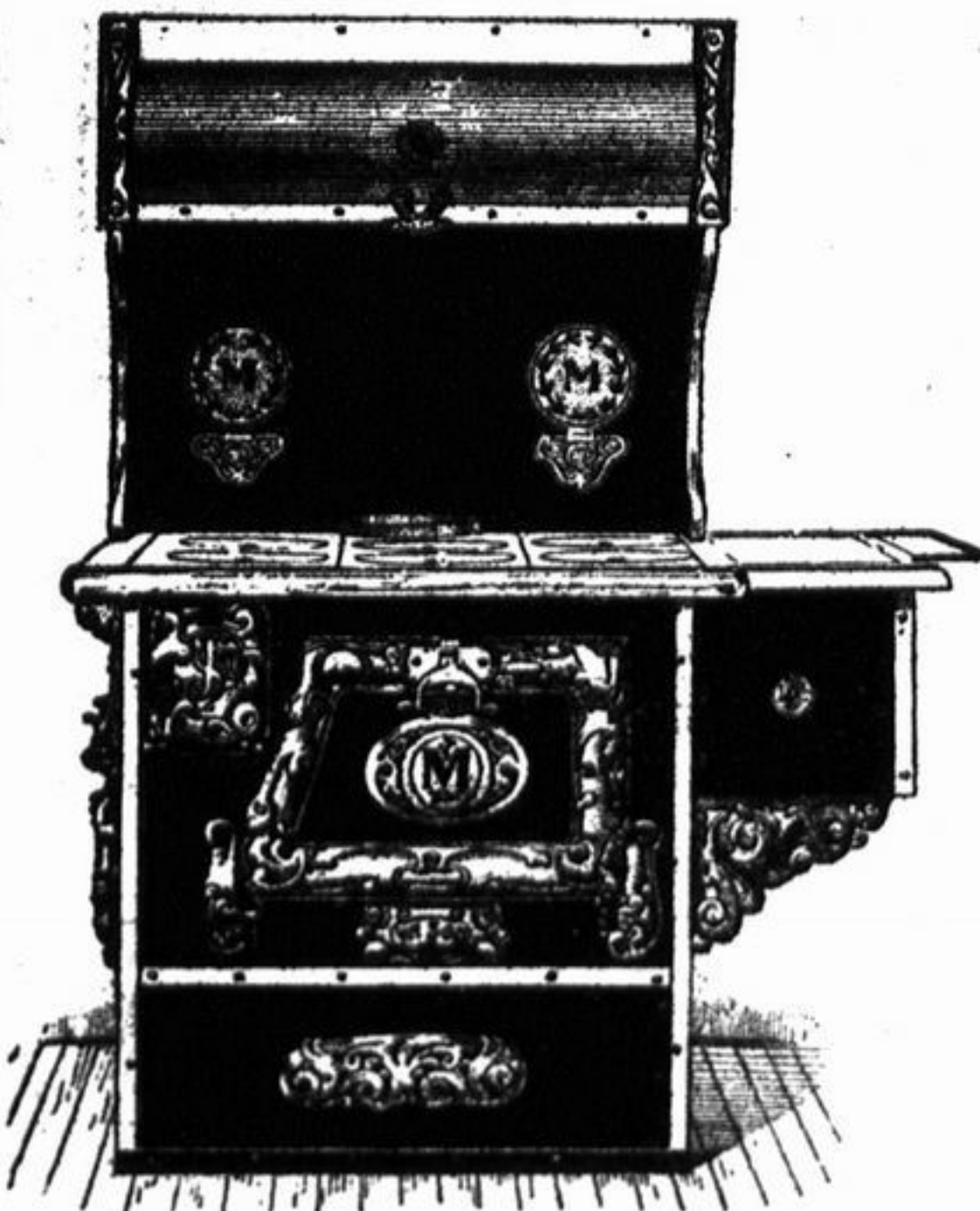

Introducing the principle of co-operation by giving farmers in addition thereto, one-half the net profits of the company thus making each dairyman directly and substantially interested in its success.
