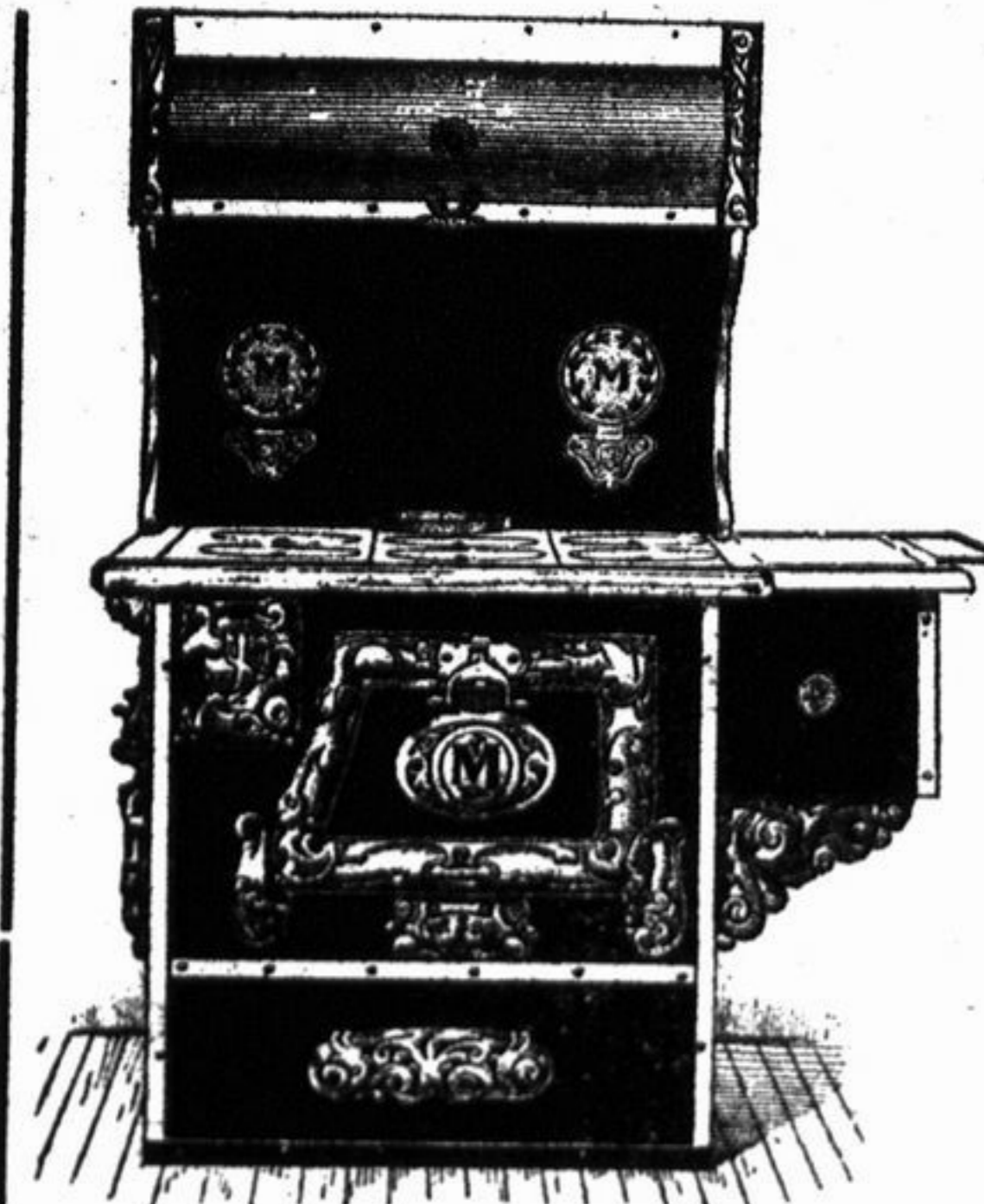

Postmaster Carpenter has received instructions to the effect that the sale of the Pan-American stamps must stop at the close of business Oct. 31st, the date of the closing of the exposition. On the next day all the stamps which remain on hand will be forwarded to Washington by registered mail to the third assistant postmaster general for the purpose of obtaining credit for the stamps. It is desired by the department that there be no surplus on hand at the time and to that end the local office is authorized to put on sale whatever Pan-American stamps it has instead of the regular issue of stamps and to sell the other only when specially called for by patrons of the office. Although the sale of these stamps will be stopped the stamps will be good for use at any time thereafter.
