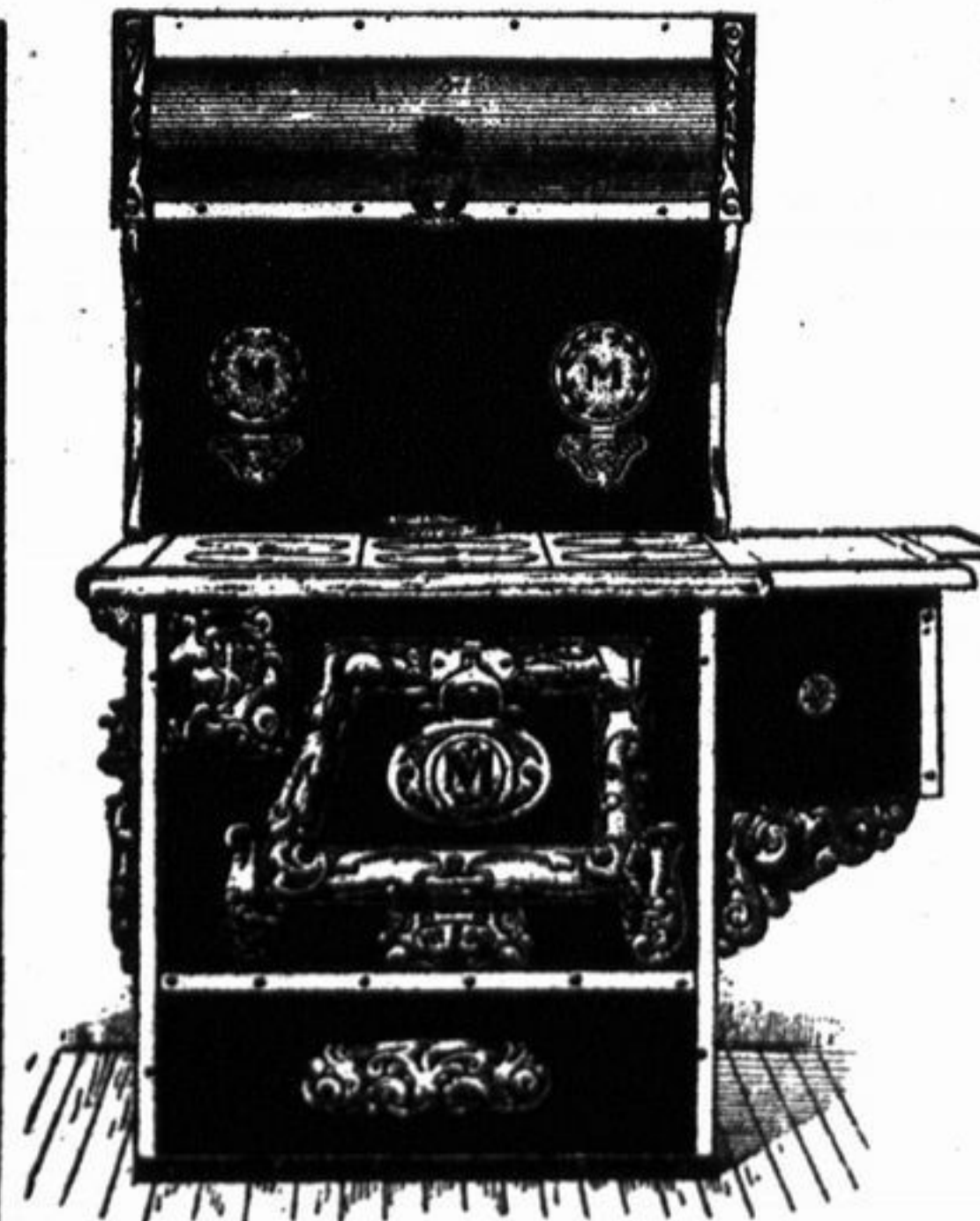

The U. S. Civil Service commission will hold examinations at several places in each state, during March and April, to secure young men and women for the government service. Last year 9,989 persons secured government positions through these examinations. Probably 10,000 appointments will be made this year. All appointments are for life and for most positions only a common school education is required. Salaries at appointment vary from \$900 to \$1200 a year with liberal promotions afterward. This affords a good opportunity for people between the ages of 16 and 45 years.
