President Roosevelt has issued his first Thanksgiving proclamation, and it reads well. It directs the attention of the American people to the fact that no people on earth have such abundant cause for thanksgiving as we have, and this is a fact which should be born in mind at all times; but especially on the day set apart for its remembrance. The manifold blessings which this great nation enjoys are the envy of the nations of the world.

"If I have to pander to any cliques, combination or movements for their approval," he declares, "I would not give the rap of my finger for it, or a nomination for it under such circumstances. My indorsement must come from the people of the country." This is the language of a man who would rather be right than be president, and who will never stoop to play politics with his great position. It comes from one who, however much he may covet honor, is actuated only by high ideals and the desire to nobly serve his countrymen.
