Scalding Steam Sweeps Car Eerry. While entering Ludington (Mich.) arbor Sunday at midnight in a heavy utherly gale, the Pere Marquette car wry. No. 16, struck a bar, disabling machinery and breaking the main d steam pipe. Great volumes of sam instantly escaped. 'Mike Taft, a coal passer, whose home was in Chicaso, was scalded to death, and two coal passers, whose names are known, were also terribly scalded. They now lie in the Marine hospital movering between life and death. Many thers who were in the hold of the car ferry received bad burns from the n and suffered great hardships turing the nine hours which followed ore they were rescued. From the ime of the accident until morning here was neither light nor heat on the boat. The wind was bitterly cold. Great seas relied across the deck, and ice formed wherever the water fell.

Seven Die in Burning Train, Seven persons were killed Monday night by an electric train catching fire in a tunnel near the Dingle station in Liverpool, England. It is said the fire started in the woodwork of a car. The strong air current through the tunnel, which is a fifth of a mile long, caused the entire train of three cars to catch on fire, igniting thousands of sleepers that were piled up, and filling the tunnel with dense smoke. Rumors were spread that forty or fifty persons had been killed, and owing to the dense volumes of smoke issuing from the tunnel it was some hours before an mtrance to the tunnel could be effeeted. Many passengers jumped from the burning train and rushed out of the tunnel, while others were dragged out by their fellow travelers in a halfsuffocated condition.

Four Perish on a Farm. At Summerville, Jefferson county, Pa, the home of John Ashbaugh, a farmer, was destroyed by fire and four persons were burned to death. One was fatally burned, while four others were seriously injured. The dead are: William Ashbaugh, 22 years old; Maybal Ashbaugh, a 12-year-old daughter; Harry Ashbaugh, a 10-year-old son; James Ashbaugh, a 9-year-old son. The injured are: Herman Ashbaugh, 8 years old; fatally burned; Mrs. Arhbangh, seriously injured; John Ashbaugh, the husband and father; seriously burned and suffering from exwure.
