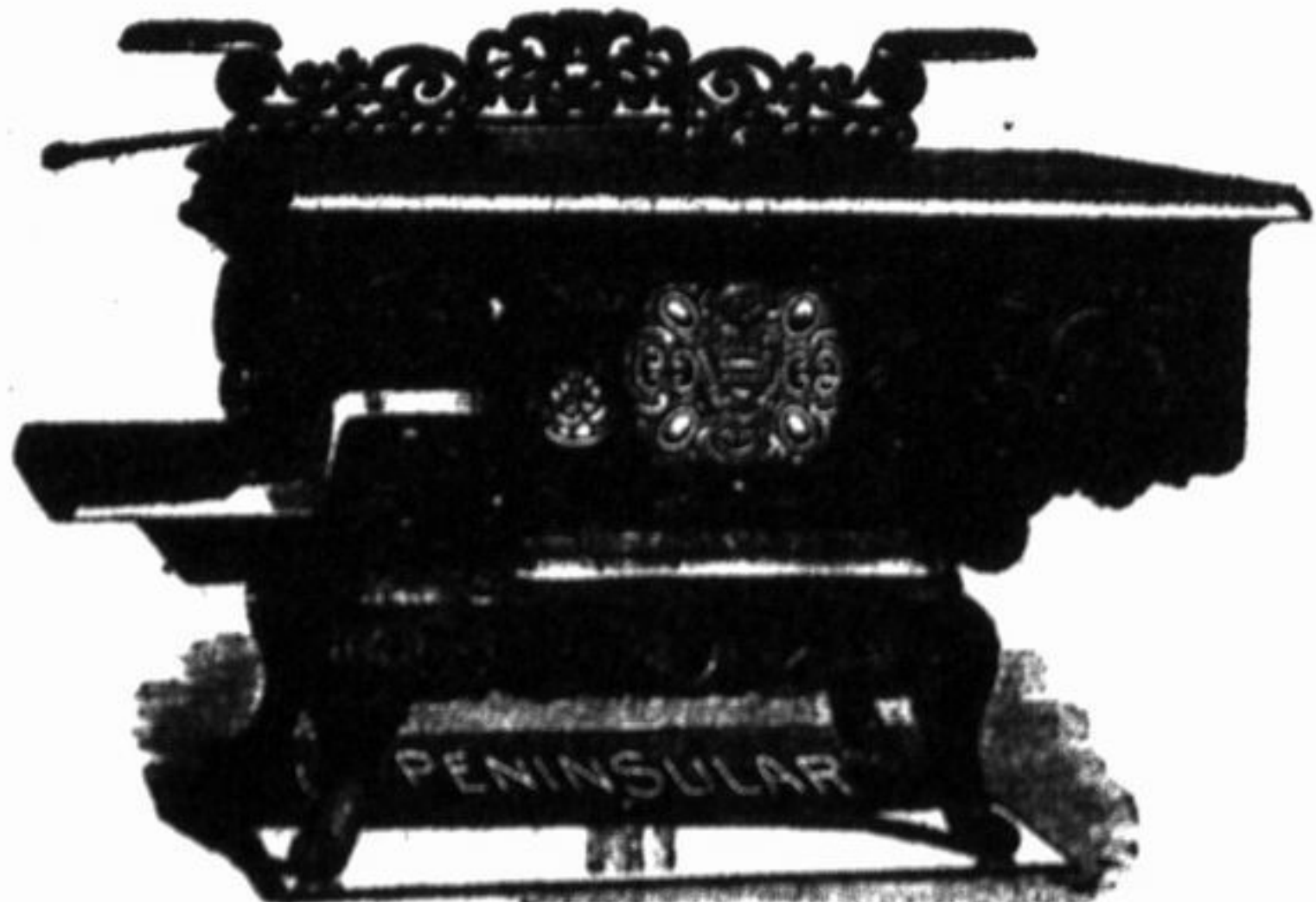

As they fly around the steep track they look like two colored streaks.
