NINETIETH YEAR CELEBRATED IAN FOR WHOM WHEATON WAS NAMED HONORED ON BIRTH ANNIVERSARY.

Hon. Warren L. Wheaton, who passed he mile stone of four score years and ten, at Wheaton, March 6th, is one of the honored pioneers of DuPage county, in the welfare of which he has been a promiment factor from very early days. In the early days he was active in assisting the first railroad laid in the county, and helped to found Wheaton College, of which he is still a trustee. He represented the people of this section in the Legislature of Illinois, in 1848. His resent home farm originally embraced 10 scres. No fence protected it from whiter's cattle but the crops were unmoested save where a deer now and then wandered through. M ORDENANCE amonding Section 5, Chapter XL of an Ordinance entitled, "An Ordinance, revising, amending and concolidating the General Ordinances of he village of Downers Grove, county DaPage, and state of Illinois."

Be it ordained by the Presdent and Board of Trustees of the village Domners Grove, DuPage county, Illiin that Section 5 of Chapter XI of an Ordinance entitled, "An Ordinance reof Ordinances of the village of Downers Grove, he and hereby is amended and to select delegates to the next State s as to read as follows

oter shall he as follows to-wit:

That each foot or pack peddler, selling one year, ten dollars.

bakery products, from wagen or sleigh, shall pay a liceuse, for one day, one dellar; for one year, ten dollars.

That each person peddling any other article not enumerated, from wagon or sleigh, shall pay a license, for one day, two dollars; for one year twenty dollars. That any person hawking or peddling

any other article not enumerated above, shall pay a license, for one day, two dollars; for one year, twenty nollars.

That each and all persons exhibiting any circus or menagerie, shall pay a license of twenty dollars for each day; or part thereof, that the same is exhibited.

That each person giving or exhibiting any theatrical show or amusement, other than a menagerie or circus, where a fee for admission thereto is charged, shall pay a license of two dollars and fifty cents for each and every exhibition; provided, however, that all shows, theatricals and exhibitions given solely for public benefit or charitable objects, shall not be re quired to pay a license.

SECTION 2. This Ordinance shall be in force from and after its passage and legal publication.

All ordinance or part of ordinances in conflict with this ordinance are hereby re-

pealed. Passed March 3, 1902.

AN ORDINANCE Licensing and Regulating the use of Billiard and Pool Tables, Pin and Ball Alleys, and Shooting Galleries within the limits of the village of Down- | Gerwig's. ers Grove, county of DuPage, and state of Illinois.

SECTION 1. Be it ordained by the President and Board of Trustees of the village of Downers Grove, county of DuPage, and state of Illinois, that no person shall keep for profit, within the limits of the village of Downers Grove, Illinois, any billiard or pool table, pin alley, ball alley or shooting gallery, without first obtaining a license therefore as bereinafter provided, under a penalty of not less than five nor more than one hundred dollars for each and every offense.

SECTION 2. The President of the village on recommendation of the Board of Trustees is hereby authorized to issue annual licenses to persons, to keep and run for profit, billiard and pool tables, pin alley or alleys, ball alley or alleys, and shooting galleries, as hereinbefore mentioned, upon the payment therefore, to the village Collector at the rate of ten dollars for each billiard or pool table, pin alley, hall alley, or shooting gallery aforesaid, and such liceuse shall expire on the first day of May next after issuance; Provided, nothing herein contained shall be construed as requiring a license from per sons keeping or running billiard or pool tables without charge for the use of the

SECTION 3. No person or persons who shall keep or run any billiard or pool table, pin alley, ball alley or shooting gallery for profit, shall permit the same to be used ouSunday, nor permit or allow any person under the age of eighteen years to use any such billiard or pool table, pin or ball alley at any time, nor permit, or al low any such persons under the age of eighteen years to remain or frequent any place where such billiard or pool tables are kept, or such pin or ball alleys are maintained, under a penalty not less than ten por more than one hundred dollars.

SECTION 4. The President of the vi lage shall upon request of Board of Trustees, revoke the license issued under this ordinance, if any of its provisions have been violated, or for any other cause at the discretion of said Board of Trustees. SECTION 5. This Ordinance shall be in

force from and after its passage and legal publication, all ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict berewith, are hereby repealed. Passed March 3, 1902.


