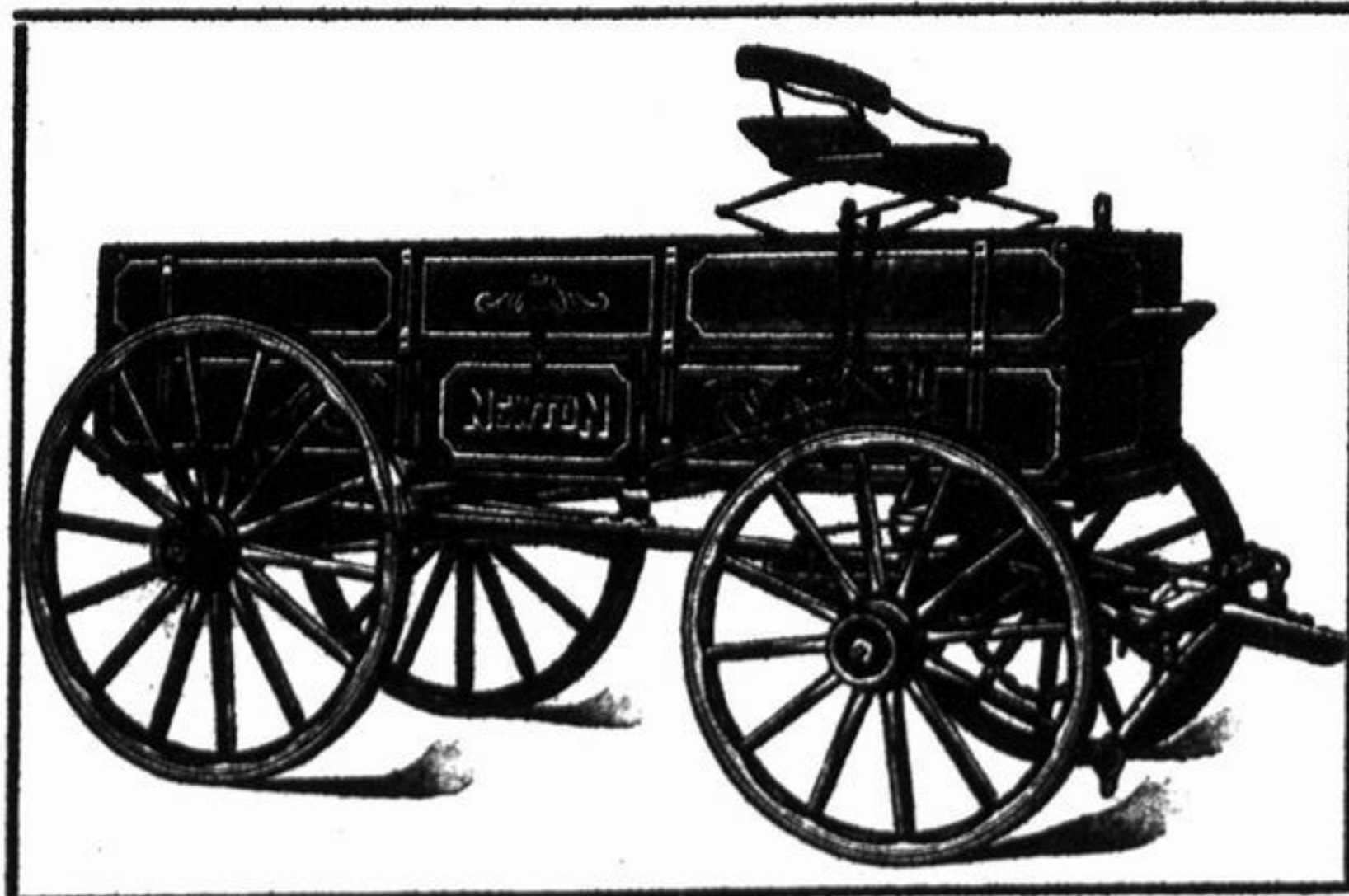

RESOLVED, that in Judge Brown we have a candidate born and raised within the district, one whose life and character are well known to the people one whose splendid success as a lawyer, eminent fairness and ability as a judge, thorough and comprehensive grasp of state and national questions, and great popularity as a campaign speaker, make him an ideal candidate, and one who, if chosen to represent this district will be fully alive to all its interests, in close touch and sympathy with all its people and thoroughly equipped to represent them and give expression to their wishes on all occasions.
