DUE TO HANNA'S FRIENDSHIP

leunter from Ohlo Has Been Untiring in His Efforts to Befriend the Man Who, in His Opinion, Did Not Have a Pair Trial.

Senator Hanna has won the first round in his fight for his friend Rathbone. Within a day or two Major Rathbone will be released from prison in Havana. A telegram was sent to Governor Wood from the war department, by instructions of President Roosevelt, ordering the acceptance of a bond for bail for Rathbone's appearance.

Several days ago Senator Hanna arranged with the Fidelity Bonding company of Baltimore to guarantee the \$100,000 bail which the court had demanded. To the surprise of every one the court refused to accept the Fidelity as security and asked that a cash deposit of \$100,000 be made before Rathbone was released from prison.

When this report was made to him Senator Hanna replied with a good deal of emphasis that he would not put up a hundred thousand dollars to be placed in the control of the Cuban courts, for if he did he should want some good guarantee, better than anyone is able to furnish at the present time, that in case he produced his man when wanted the money in turn should be forthcoming.

This demand for the cash nettled the senator from Ohio and he started out to see if a civilized method of doing business could be applied to Cuba, at least as long as the island is under American control. The result was the order which Secretary Root sent Gov. Wood. As soon as the details can be arranged the bond of the Fidelity company will be accepted and Major Rathbone will walk out of jail.

It is a curious fact that Senator Hanna's earnest stand for his friend has attracted a vast amount of attention throughout the country. Hundreds of letters and telegrams are pouring in upon him, commending his course. Many of the writers say that they do not know whether Rathbone is innocent or guilty, but they like a man who sticks up for his friend in an hour of trouble. In the attitude of Mr. Hauna concerning the affair the American people appear to see a quality which they like.

Mr. Hanna is more than ever convinced of Rathbone's Innocence. He has personally interviewed a number of men, Americans, who attended the trial every day and who declare there was not a scintilla of real evidence that Rathbone was guilty of stealing or embezzling and that the case brought against him would not have secured conviction of a tramp in any American police court. Three American newspaper men who watched the trial day after day say Rathbone was convicted unjustly, and that he could never have been convicted at all had it not been for the in sence which Governor Wood exercised upon the court. The five judges who tried the case there before no jury were all ap-

It is said that nearly everyone in Havana-Americans, Cubans and Spaniards-believes Rathbone innocent. Scores of visitors call to see him every day. After his bail has been accepted he will wait till President Palma takes office and demand a new

Veteran Southern Soldier and Statesman Victim of Beart Disease,

Columbus, S. C., special: General Wade Hampton died not altogether unexpectedly at 9 o'clock Friday morning. He had celebrated his eightyfourth birthday anniversary last week. Death was due to valvular disease of the heart. He had been unconscious for several hours. Twice this winter he had sustained attacks that had greatly weakened him, but he railled wonderfully. He was out driving a week ago, but it was evident that his strength was deserting him,

The family of Gen. Hampton objected to a state funeral. Bells were tolled in all towns of the state when the news was received and many schools were closed.

Forty Killed in Japanese Cyclone.

Tacoma, Wash., dispatch: Oriental advices say that Japan was visited by a cyclone three weeks ago. It detroyed seventeen fishing villages, killing forty persons and injuring hundreds of others. 
