## CALL DEMOCRAT CONVENTION

DEMOCRACY TO NAME A FULL COUNT TICKET AT WHEATON SATURDAY.

Prohibition Convention at Big Woods Today Lombard Agog Over Suit for Replevin-Other County News From Exchanges.

The county convention of the democra tic party of DuPage county is called meet in the court house in Wheaton Saturday, May 31st, 1901 at 2 p. m. for the following purposes: 1st. To nominate candidates for toe following county offices: County judge, sheriff, county treasurer, county clerk and county superintendent of schools. 2nd. To elect a county democratic central committee, to consist of a chairman, treasurer, secretary and one additional member from each voting precinct of the county. 3rd. To elect five delegates and five alternates to the state democratic convention to be held Springfield, June 17th, 1903. Also ten delegates and ten alternates to the congressional convention of the Fourteenth congressional district of Illinois, hereafter to be called; and ten delegates and ten alternates to the senatorial convention of the Forty-first senatorial district, hereafter to be called. 4th. To transact such other business as said county convention may deem proper. The basis of representation to said county convention shall be: One delegate for every 25 votes or major fraction thereof cast in DuPage county for the demogratic candidates for presidential electors at the election in November, 1900, as follows: Addison 5, Downers Grove 18, Milton 10, Wayne 8, Winfield 10, Bloomingdale 6, Lisle 7, York 11, Naperville 11, total 81.


