

**SIDEWALK ORDINANCE NO. 74.**

AN ORDINANCE providing for a brick sidewalk on the east side of Washington street in Lyman's addition to the village of Downers Grove, DuPage county and state of Illinois.

Be it ordained by the president and board of trustees of the village of Downers Grove, Illinois:

Section 1. That a sidewalk shall be constructed on the east side of Washington street in said village immediately in front of the following lots and parcels of ground, to-wit: Lots eight, nine and ten of block two of Lyman's addition to Downers Grove, DuPage county and state of Illinois.

Sec. 2. That the entire cost of said sidewalk shall be levied upon the said lots and parcels of ground.

Sec. 3. Said sidewalk shall be constructed under the supervision of, and to the acceptance of the street commissioner of said village, and the same shall be constructed four feet, eight inches in width, of vitrified brick as follows:

The ground upon which the sidewalk is proposed to be laid, shall be thoroughly underdrained with good tile, three inches in diameter, and the foundation upon which the walk is to be laid shall be made of cinders twelve inches in thickness. The brick shall be of the kind made by the Streater Paving Brick company of Streater, Illinois, or equal in quality, and commonly known as "Repressed Pavers," said brick shall be laid flat in sand, and firmly imbedded therein, and shall be laid so that when the walk is completed the surface shall be reasonably smooth, and sufficiently convex as to carry the water falling thereon off the walk.

Sec. 4. That the owners of said lots and parcels of ground are hereby required to construct said sidewalk in front of said lots and parcels of ground, agreeable to the provisions of said section 3 of this ordinance, within thirty days after publication thereof.

Sec. 5. Upon default of said owner, or owners, to construct that part of said sidewalk in front of their lot or lots, or parcels of ground, within thirty days after the publication of this ordinance, it shall be the duty of said street commissioner to cause the same to be constructed in behalf of said village at the cost of said owner. The said street commissioner shall certify to a bill to the village clerk, together with a description of said lots, the name of the owner, or owners, thereof and the frontage of his respective lot on said sidewalk.

Sec. 6. The village collector is hereby designated as the officer to collect the special tax herein provided, and to whom warrants for the same shall be directed.

Sec. 7. The village clerk shall in all respects comply with the provisions of an act of the general assembly of the state of Illinois, entitled "An act to provide additional means for the construction of sidewalks in cities, towns and villages," in force July 1st, A. D. 1875. If said land is delinquent after return of said warrant by the village collector, it shall be the duty of said clerk to make a report of such special tax in writing to the county treasurer and ex-officio county collector on or before the 31st day of March, A. D. 1903, as required by said act.

Sec. 8. This ordinance shall be in force from and after its passage and legal publication.

Sec. 9. All ordinances in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed.

**SIDEWALK ORDINANCE NO. 76.**

AN ORDINANCE providing for a brick sidewalk on the south side of West Prairie avenue between Oakwood avenue and Middaugh avenue, in the village of Downers Grove, county of DuPage and state of Illinois.

Be it ordained by the president and board of trustees of the village of Downers Grove, Illinois:

Section 1. That a sidewalk shall be constructed on the south side of West Prairie avenue, between Oakwood avenue and Middaugh avenue, immediately in front of the following lots and parcels of ground, to-wit: Lots one and twenty-nine, of block forty, of E. H. Prince's addition to the village of Downers Grove, DuPage county and state of Illinois.

Sec. 2. That the entire cost of said sidewalk shall be levied upon the said lots and parcels of ground.

Sec. 3. Said sidewalk shall be constructed under the supervision and to the acceptance of the street commissioner of said village, and the same shall be constructed four feet eight inches in width, of vitrified brick, as follows:

The ground upon which the sidewalk is to be laid shall be thoroughly underdrained with good tile, three inches in diameter, and the foundation upon which the walk is to be laid shall be made of cinders twelve inches in thickness, the brick to be of the kind made by the Streater Paving Brick company, of Streater, Illinois, or equal in quality, and commonly known as "Repressed Pavers," said brick shall be laid flat in sand and firmly imbedded therein, and shall be laid so that when the walk is completed the surface shall be reasonably smooth and sufficiently convex as to carry the water falling thereon off the walk.

Sec. 4. That the owner of said lots and parcels of ground are hereby required to construct said sidewalk in front of said lots and parcels of ground, agreeable to the provisions of said section 3 of this ordinance, within thirty days after the publication thereof.

Sec. 5. Upon the default of said owner, or owners, to construct that part of said sidewalk immediately in front of their lot, or lots, or parcels of ground, within thirty days after the publication of this ordinance, it shall be the duty of said street commissioner to cause the same to be constructed in behalf of said village at the cost of said owner. The said street commissioner shall certify to a bill to the village clerk, together with a description of said lots, the name of the owner, or owners, thereof and the frontage of his respective lot on said sidewalk.

Sec. 6. The village collector is hereby designated as the officer to collect the special tax herein provided, and to whom warrants for the same shall be directed.

Sec. 7. The village clerk shall in all respects comply with the provisions of an act of the general assembly of the state of Illinois, entitled "An act to provide additional means for the construction of sidewalks in cities, towns and villages," in force July 1st, A. D. 1875. If said land is delinquent after return of said warrant by the village collector, it shall be the duty of said clerk to make a report of such special tax in writing to the county treasurer and ex-officio county collector on or before the 31st day of March, A. D. 1903, as required by said act.

Sec. 8. This ordinance shall be in force from and after its passage and legal publication.

AN ORDINANCE providing for a brick sidewalk on the east side of Oakwood avenue between Belmont street and West Prairie avenue and immediately in front of the following lots and parcels of ground, to-wit: Lots twelve, thirteen, fourteen, fifteen, sixteen, seventeen, eighteen, nineteen, twenty, of block thirty-nine; lots seventeen, eighteen, nineteen, twenty, twenty-one, twenty-two, twenty-three, twenty-four, twenty-five, twenty-six, twenty-seven and twenty-eight, of block forty, all of E. H. Prince & Co.'s addition to Downers Grove, county of DuPage and state of Illinois.

Be it ordained by the president and board of trustees of the village of Downers Grove, Illinois:

Sec. 1.
