'The country is prosperous,' says the (Democratic) Cincinnati Enquirer. 'The issue dixit of no public man, no matter how eloquent the rhetoric may pour from his mouth, can avail against a condition that makes so many people happy.'

If the country could just stand the experiment it might be interesting to let the Democratic party handle the Philippine job. Of course, they would make a mess of it, and just as of course the American people don't want any more Democratic experiments.

While it is true Mr. Bryan has picked out three campaign issues, he is not 'paramounted' one. But this makes no difference. Any, either and all of the issues combined are sufficient to defeat the Democratic party. And, after all, this is the ultimate desire of the body of the voters.

Several very prominent Democrats and many not so prominent have given it out as their opinion that the Democrats cannot win on this or that issue. The faithful are patiently waiting for some Democrat, with or without prominence, who will make known an issue upon which they can win.

There is no danger that either the Democrats or the Republicans will slight the Philippine question in the coming congressional election. Therefore it is not a matter of such great concern how many copies of Republican congressman's speeches the Democratic congressional committee sends out.

The people of Illinois are enjoying their full share of a nation's prosperity, thanks to a Republican administration, state and national, and are not to be misled by clap-trap arguments and catch phrases. These, with wild accusations and indiscriminate attacks, are still the methods of the Democratic party. They will be resorted to both in the editorial sanctum and on the stump.

Editor Bryan has recently written and said much about 'the price of harmony.' He did the same thing about six years ago and again about two years ago in regard to the price of wheat and the price of silver. There may be no logical connection, commercial or otherwise, between Democratic harmony, wheat and silver, but that makes no difference to Bryan.

AN ORDINANCE.

AN ORDINANCE amending sections 20, 21, 24, 25, 26 and 27 of chapter 4 of the general ordinances of the village of Downers Grove, entitled 'An ordinance for amending, revising and consolidating the general ordinances of the village of Downers Grove, DuPage county, Illinois.'

Section 1. Be it ordained by the president and board of trustees of the village of Downers Grove, county of DuPage and state of Illinois, that sections 20, 21, 24, 25, 26 and 27 of the general ordinances of the village of Downers Grove, DuPage county, Illinois, be and hereby are amended to read as follows:

Sec. 20. There shall be appointed at the first regular meeting of the board of trustees, in May of each year, a Street Commissioner to serve until his successor has been appointed and qualified.

Should the office of Street Commissioner become vacant from any cause the office of ground master and commissioner of health shall also immediately become vacant.

Sec. 21. It shall be the duty of the Street Commissioner to superintend the streets, alleys, side and cross walks and public parks in said village. To keep said streets and alleys in good condition and repair, free from all obstructions and everything that will interfere with travel thereon, and to have all rubbish, nuisances and dead animals removed from the streets, alleys and public grounds as provided by the ordinances of the village; to remove all laborers in the streets, alleys and public grounds of the village; to keep them and their tools and to report the results of their regular meeting to the president and board of trustees. In addition to his duties as Street Commissioner he shall perform all the duties of the Commissioner of Health and Pound Master, and such other duties as may be prescribed by law and the ordinances of the village.

Sec. 24. There shall be appointed at the first regular meeting of the board of trustees in May of each year an officer styled 'Commissioner of Health,' to serve until the first meeting of the board of trustees of the succeeding fiscal year, and until a successor shall be duly appointed, to serve as Commissioner of Health, and shall be the same person appointed as Street Commissioner of said village.

The Commissioner of Health shall perform such duties as required by law and the ordinances of the village of Downers Grove.

Sec. 25. At the first regular meeting in May of each year of the board of trustees there shall be appointed as many regular policemen for night and day service to serve during the pleasure of the board as the board of trustees shall deem necessary.

The president of the village may in case of emergency, without the action of the board of trustees, in his discretion appoint as many special policemen as may be required and considered necessary to preserve the public peace, which said policemen shall serve for a period not exceeding forty-eight hours from the time of their appointment.

It shall be the duty of the president of the village to report to the board of trustees all appointments of special policemen made by him at the first regular meeting of said board after such appointment.

Sec. 26. All policemen shall be citizens of the state of Illinois and actual residents of said village, and shall be commissioned under the hand of the president, attested by the clerk. They shall perform such duties as shall be prescribed by law and the ordinances of the village.

Sec. 27. Officers of said village shall be entitled to fees and salaries as follows:

The village clerk shall receive the sum of \$15 per month for attending all meetings, serving notices and recording ordinances and resolutions requiring record.

The police magistrate shall be entitled to the same fees that justices of the peace are entitled to receive for like service.

The village treasurer shall receive \$100 per annum, payable at the end of each year.

The village collector shall receive the sum of \$200 per annum, payable monthly, in full for all services rendered in accordance with the ordinances of the village.

The village attorney shall receive \$15 per month, which shall be in full for all services, except suits in behalf of said village presented or defended in courts of record, and in special matters in the county court, he shall be entitled to reasonable compensation for the services rendered, and in special assessment matters in the county court he shall be entitled to such reasonable allowance as shall be taxed part of the costs and expense assessed against the property benefited.

The pound master shall be entitled to receive a fee of 50 cents for each animal taken and impounded by him; provided, that if the person appointed pound master shall also be street commissioner, then the fees received by him shall be paid to the village treasurer.

The street commissioner shall receive pay at the rate of 20 cents per hour while performing the duties required of him by the ordinances of this village.

The fire marshal shall be entitled to receive a compensation for his services of \$25 per year, payable at the end of the fiscal year.

The superintendent of the electric light and water system shall receive for his services an amount not to exceed \$100 per month, the exact sum he is to receive to be fixed by resolution at the time of his appointment.

The health commissioner, when also serving as street commissioner, shall not receive any compensation from the village in addition to his salary as said street commissioner.

The regular night policeman shall receive as salary the sum of \$45 per month.

Special policemen when on duty shall receive at compensation \$2 per day of ten hours.

The fees or salary of any officer of this village may be increased or diminished at any time by resolution of the board of trustees, except that the salary of any officer shall not be increased during his term of office.

Sec. 2. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with this ordinance are hereby repealed.

Sec. 3. This ordinance shall be in force from and after its passage and publication.
