Certain of the candidates on the prohibition ticket must have been reminded forcibly of the results of a certain school election two years ago, when the returns were received.

The promised coup of the democrats to elect Chester D. Bartlett as sheriff failed to materialize, notwithstanding the popularity of their candidate.

IS CARELESS WITH POWDER

JOHN RUDNICK OF NAPERVILLE TERRIBLY BURNED LAST WEEK.

All at Itasca Fired—Painters Hand Car Destroyed by Fast Train—Other County News From Exchanges.

Johnnie Rudnick, aged 14 years, who is employed as waterboy at the Deless & Shepard stone quarries at Naperville, was severely and probably fatally burned about the head and body, Friday, from the burning of a quantity of blasting powder.

A. G. Chestman's mill at Itasca was fired by sparks from a passing train last Thursday night at 12 o'clock and but for the prompt assistance of the citizens who formed a bucket brigade the building would have burned to the ground.

On the 8th of May, 1901, William Clark, a passenger on the Illinois Central railroad, on one of the Kentucky lines, was severely injured by the ditching of the train.

A hand car used by the C. B. & Q. painters was badly demolished by being struck by a fast train Friday. The employees were rounding the curve at the drive bridge in the eastern part of Naperville when the engine loomed up before them on the same track.

A little daughter of Charlie Schatz, liv- at Wheaton, fell from the upper window of the barn while playing one day last week. The child was picked up for dead and a physician summoned.
