It must be evident to every thoughtful observer of political conditions that President Roosevelt is practically certain to be nominated and elected president in 1924.

Illinois republicans have one special cause for rejoicing at the satisfactory outcome of the congressional elections, because the election of a republican majority in the next house of representatives makes reasonably certain the elevation of Congressman Joseph G. Cannon to the speakership of that body, which will give Illinois the position of influence and power in the government which practically is second only to the presidency.

Eighty-nine republicans have been elected to the next house of representatives in this state, leaving but 64 to the democrats and independents.

FARMERS ALONG RURAL MAIL ROUTES ARE VICTIMIZED—OLD RESIDENT DEAD.

Wheaton to Have Extension of Water Mains—First White Child Born in County Dead—Other County News From Exchanges.

The latest scheme for working the farmers along the rural mail delivery routes is novel. It was worked to a finish near Warrenville and Hinsdale.
