## SCIENTIFIC OBSERVATIONS.

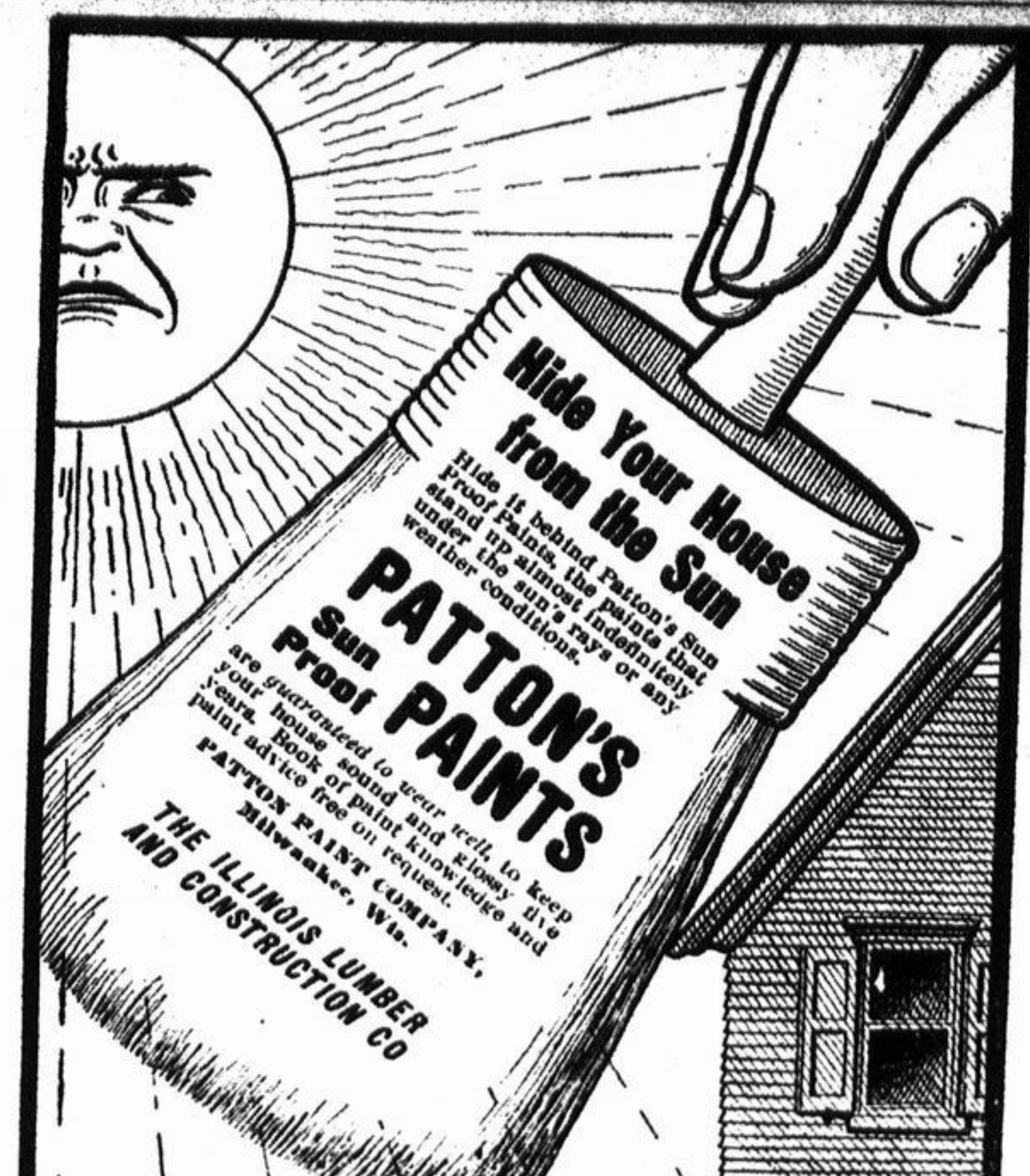
