

ing, which is to-day just what it was 1,500 years ago. They were supposed for a time to be the only people in the world without a taste for music and unable to sing a song, but these beliefs concerning them have been proven to be not

wholly correct. The Lappe are Lutherans. Before they embraced the Christian religion they worshiped the sun, the moon and the stars, and believed that Heaven was just like this world, even to a man getting back in life all his dead dogs.

INDUSTRIAL ITEMS.

Within four years 80 factories have sprung up in Germany for the manufacture of sand-lime bricks.

As the inventor his hope is that the development of the ideal turbine may be hastened thereby." The engine is of novel design and Col. Astor thinks that the advantages derivable from it will be reduced weight, higher steam efficiency and "higher machinery efficiency, by reason of the reduced size, enabling the parts to be fitted more perfectly, permitting the diminution of friction and also the reduction of the leakage
