Many persons in the midst of large families are afflicted with a loneliness which robs life of much of the enjoyment it ought to supply. 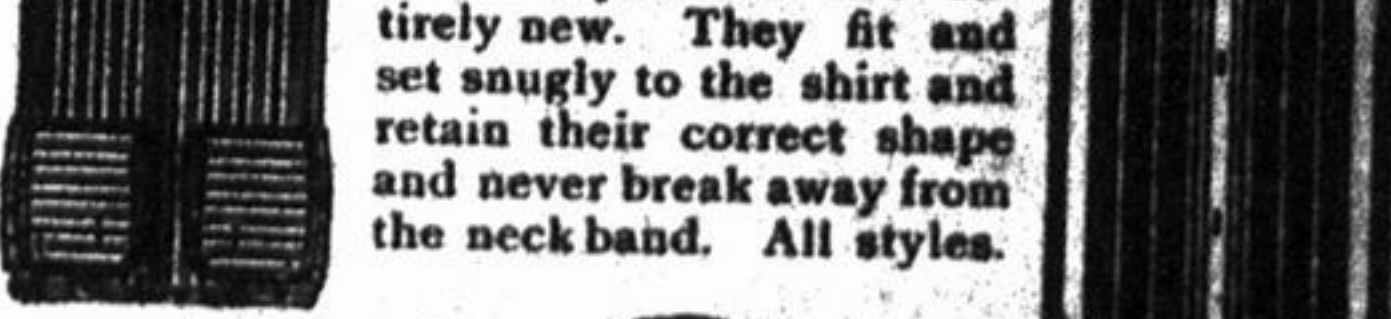
