

FILARIA IS A NEW DISEASE.

Responsible for the Death of Many

American Soldiers. Capt. Charles Kieeffer, a United States army surgeon, says the Philippines are infested with mosquitoes more troublesome and dangerous from a medical point of view than those that swarm in the Jersey swamps. A strange malady known as filaria is traced directly to them, and is common among the American soldiers quartered on the islands. contract the disease by drinking water from stagnant pools in which

the mosquitoes have laid their eggs. The first indication of filaria appears in the form of a worm in the victim's thorax. This develops into elephantiasis, which causes the patient terrible pains, accompanied by a constant cough. The sufferer worst at night, and the patient becomes a prey to insomnia.

The only remedy lies in an opera tion, which in itself is dangerous and rarely successful. If the worm, which is a female, is injured and dies through the operation, its poison gets into the blood, the disease is increased a thousandfold and the chances of recovery are small.


