Charity in England.
Some idea of the charitable disposition of the British people is found in the report of the charity commissioners, just issued. The total value of investments held by the official trustees of charitable funds at the close of last year was \$22,314,735, divided into 22,798 separate grants. The aggregate income from stocks, securities and annuities aggregated \$646,517 in 1902. During the three-quarters ending Dec. 31, 1901, 1,670 new charities founded by will of deed came to the notice of the commissioners, involving a capital of \$6,500,000 and upward.
