### SYNOPSIS OF NEW GAME LAW.

That persons may readily understand the main points of the new game law which goes into effect July 1, next. State Game Commissioner Lovejoy submits the following synopsis of the law, which is heing sent out by County Game Warden G. W. Clark, Jr., of Wheaton:

You can hust and kill quail with gun only between November 10 and December 20, of each year. You must not kill any prairie chicken

or grouse for the period of four years, from the lat of July, 1903.

You must not net, trap or ensuare quail or prairie chicken at any time or under

any circumstances You can kill wood-cock and morning doves only between August 1 and Decem-

ber I, of each year. You can kill gray, red, fox or black squirrels only between July 1 and Decem-

her 31, of each year. ver only between September 1 and May 1.

You can kill all kinds of snipe and ploof each succeeding year.

You can kill wild gress, ducks and heant and other water fowl only between ptember 1 and April 15, of each succeed

You must not kill wild geese, ducks, cant and other water fowl after sundown a before aunries of each succeeding day. on must not kill wild geese, ducks, at or other fowl from any steam boat, sent electric or gasoline launch o my sink hox or sneak boat or artifind in the open waters of this state. is may be built on the shore, or in seds, willows, brush, wild rice ion, but not out in the

brant, quail, prairie chicken, grouse or squirrel for market or commercial pur-

You must not sell or have in possession for the purpose of selling or transport for the purpose of sale, any wild geese, ducks, brant, quail, prairie chicken, grouse or squirrel that has been killed in the state of Illinois.

You must not at any time, kill more than fifty wild ducks, geese or brant, or more than twenty-five quail or game birds

or any other game birds in one day. You must not kill, expose or offer for sale or have in posession, except for breeding purposes, any wild buck. dee or fawn for a period of ten years from July 1,1903. You must not kill, expose or offer for

sale or have in possession, except for breeding purposes, any wild turkey, pheasant or partridge of any kind for a period

Breeders can kill and sell wock pheasants between the 1st day of November and the 31st day of December, inclusive, of each year upon a permit issued to them

You must not kill, catch or have in possession, living or dead, any wild bird, or part of bird, other than a game bird, except English sparrow or black bird or chicken hawk, and you must not purchase

You must not destroy or remove from grouse, quail, wild turkey, duck, goose,

You can kill for commercial purposes you for a meal and is willing to work for and transport for sale or market all kinds of snipe, plover, mourning doves and rab

You must not offer for sale or transport for the purpose of selling any snipe, plover or mourning doves after the expira-Gen. J. S. Wilcox, in a talk about Kane tion of five days succeeding the first day of the closed season nor can you sell the same during the first two days of the open

> All non-residents desiring to hant and kill game in this state must take out s non-resident liceuse and pay therefor \$15 per annum and also 50 cents to the clerk for issuing the same, the license to be secured from the clerk of each county.

All residents of the state who bunt game must take out a resident bunter's license and pay for the same \$1 per annum, and license can be secured from the clerk of any village, city, town or county in the

All money received for license goes into the game protection fund, to be need to pay game wardens and their traveling expenses and all other expenses of the game department

All licenses, whether residents or nonresidents, expire on the lat day of June, of each year.

All hunters, resident or non-resident, must have their hunting license with them at all times when hunting and be prepared to identify themselves as the person named in such license,

You mrst not use or attempt to use the license of another person or in any man ner make any changes in any license for the purpose of transfering the same, under penalty of prosecution for forgery.

Owners of farm lands, their children or tenants can hunt and kill game on their own farm during the open season when it is lawful to kill game, without procuring such resident license, but they must not hunt beyond the lines of their own farm lands without a hunter's license.

You must not use any ferret at any time or under any circumstances for the hunting, capturing or killing any game animals or rabbits in this state.

For the purpose of enforcing the game and license laws there is a state game commissioner, ten game wardens for the state and one or more local game wardens for each county whose duty it shall be see that all game laws are observed and to prosecute all persons who violate them.
