Sycamore Wins Contest

DeKalb County Court House Fight Settled By Compromise.

New Democratic Paper For DuPage County—Wheaton to Enforce Curfew Law—Other County News From Exchanges.

The fight over the location of the county court house, which has been waged for years between Sycamore and DeKalb has finally been settled. Sycamore gets the court house, which will be built on the old site. In addition a \$150,000 home for aged people will be erected, probably on the line of the electric road between the two cities. The settlement is the result of the acceptance Monday by the board of supervisors, by a vote of 18 to 11, of a compromise offered at the special session in May, under which Sycamore withdraws its offer to pay \$70,000 toward the county building, and puts \$50,000 of it with the \$100,000 put up by DeKalb to build the aged people's home. The county to build the court house on the old site in Sycamore. The plan was promoted by Isaac Ellwood, Jacob Halsh, Charles Bishop, D. J. Caros and others from both cities, and though it did not agree with the wishes of many DeKalbites, yet their leaders pushed it. I. L. Ellwood said Monday, "The home for aged people shall be not only a credit to DeKalb county, but shall be known throughout the United States."

The DuPage County Publishing company took hold of the Democrat last week. The company consists of 100 persons who have subscribed \$10 each, making \$1,000, and the other \$1,000 is allowed John C. Neltner, for the material and good will of the Democrat. J. O. Moore of Bloomingdale has been elected president of the new company, J. C. Nelson vice-president, H. F. Senne of Addison secretary, and J. Marhauser of Downers Grove treasurer. The following gentlemen have been chosen directors: H. F. Senne, J. O. Moore, C. D. Bartlett, J. C. Neltner, B. H. Gamson, O. H. Stango, Bert C. White, J. L. Dille and Chas. Schwartz. There is no democratic newspaper in the congressional district and it will be the object of the company to disseminate the good old democracy through the length and breadth of northern Illinois. The editorial staff has not been chosen but will be this week. Mr. Newcomer, who has been with the paper the past year, will be retained as foreman or general superintendent of the printing plant.—Journal.

DuPage county had a good run of steers on the Chicago market last week. Wednesday, June 24, Silas Palmer received and sold four loads of choice steers from C. Hollenbach of Bloomingdale that averaged 1430 pounds and sold for \$5.30 per hundred which is the top price for a four load bunch from this county this year and speaks well for Mr. Hollenbach as a feeder. F. R. Crane also had two loads which brought \$6.00 per hundred. Fred Rittmiller had a good load of black cattle that were a credit to him, and Stanch Brothers had in three loads of steers that sold at satisfactory prices. DuPage is coming ahead on feeding cattle which is considerable less work than milking cows.

In view of robberies, recent arrests and of the grave suspicion against several other boys and young men of Wheaton, the mayor will enforce in the future the extreme limit of proper conduct on public streets. The marshal and his assistants are instructed to arrest under the curfew law any person under the age of 18 years found on the streets after the hour of 9 o'clock p. m., unless their parents can show good and reasonable cause for same, and the age limit will not exempt from arrest those who are suspected of evil doings.

A novel scheme for furnishing important news to the farmer is now under consideration by the officials of the post office department of this country. A special stamp to authorize the postmaster to open a letter and telephone its contents to the person addressed, will save time and prove a valuable adjunct to the rural free delivery system. The new system will practically extend the present special delivery system to every family who has a telephone. The matter will come up before congress.

Judge Rath last week appointed A. H. Fairbank of West Chicago, and John Mueller of Elmhurst as members of the board of review. The other member is Thos. Betts of Naperville. The board must meet on or before the second Monday in July to organize, and will then pass on the real estate and personal property assessments of the county as returned by the township assessors.

Judge George W. Brown of Wheaton has announced his candidacy for the nomination of governor on the republican ticket. Judge Brown is being backed by many influential politicians from the northern part of Illinois and they have already begun an active campaign for this well known and popular jurist.—Anrona Beacon.

Gov. Yates has issued a proclamation designating Monday, June 15, as flag day, in accordance with an act of the recent assembly. The governor recommends that the day be observed by appropriate exercises and ceremonies and also suggests that all schools observe the day.

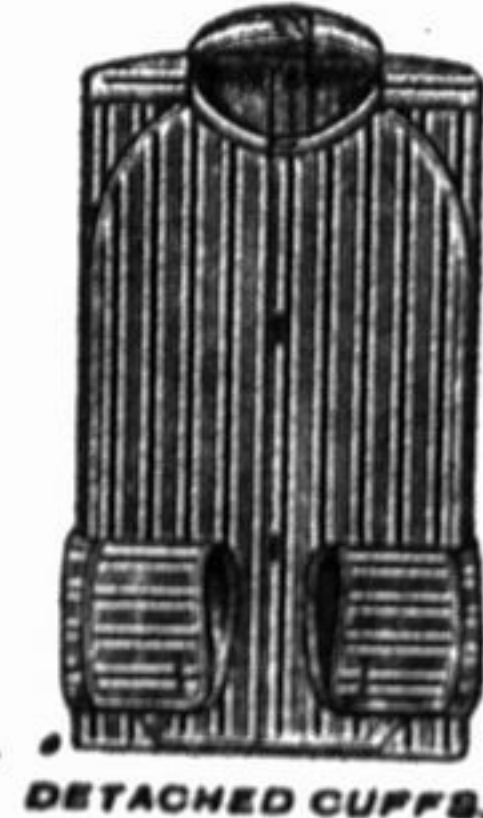
