WALKS OF STONE OR CEMENT.

and in force July 1, 1875," in accordance with which said statute this ordinance is passed, and if any land is delinquent after the return of the warrant of collection of said special tax by the said village collector to the said clerk, then said clerk shall make report of all such special taxes in writing to the county treasurer and ex-officio county collector of DuPage county, state of Illinois, prior to April, in each year as required by said act; said county treasurer and ex-officio county collector shall then have full authority to collect the same, as provided by said act.

Sec. 11. That the central portion of all streets (except in streets and portions thereof designated by the board of trustees as business streets) shall be used and improved as a roadway, which said roadway shall, in the several streets of the village, be of the following width: In streets sixty-six feet or more in width the roadway shall be twenty-seven feet wide. In streets less than sixty-six feet in width the roadway shall be twenty-four feet in width.

That upon the edges of said roadways at the outer lines thereof, there may be erected and maintained curbs of stone, brick or other suitable material. The portion of each street lying between the curb line and the outer line of the street shall be used and occupied for sidewalks, grass plots and ornamental grounds.

Sec. 12. If any person shall build, renew, lay or relay, or attempt to build, renew or relay any sidewalk or portion thereof ordered constructed or renewed, in a manner contrary to the provisions of this ordinance or of the particular ordinance relating to such sidewalks, such persons so offending shall be fined five dollars for every such offense, and a like sum for every day he shall neglect or refuse to relay, remove or construct said sidewalk, or any portion thereof, in conformity with said provision, and neither any length of time such walk may be allowed to remain after having been built, nor the connecting of a street crossing with the same shall be construed as an acceptance thereof by the village board, or as relieving such party from the above penalty.

Sec. 13. It shall be the duty of the street commissioner to see that the provisions of this ordinance are strictly enforced.

Sec. 14. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with or contrary to any of the provisions of this ordinance are each and all of them hereby repealed.

Sec. 15. This ordinance shall be in force and effect from and after its passage, approval and publication in the manner required by law.

An ordinance making appropriation for corporate purposes for the fiscal year beginning May 1, 1903, and ending April 30, 1904.

Be it ordained by the president and board of trustees of the village of Downers Grove, DuPage county, state of Illinois:

Section 1. That the following sums or so much thereof as may be authorized by law are hereby appropriated for corporate purposes of the village of Downers Grove for the fiscal year commencing May 1, 1903, and ending April 30, 1904: For salaries of policeman and certain village officers \$1300. For street lighting \$2500. For improvement in streets and alleys \$1200. For miscellaneous claims against village \$750. For payment of interest on the general bonds of village \$575. For sinking fund for the payment of the general bonds of village \$300. Total \$6,625.

Sec. 2. That the expenditures of the said village for the fiscal year beginning May 1, 1903, and ending April 30, 1904, are hereby limited to the amounts above mentioned.

Sec. 3. That this ordinance shall be in force from and after its passage and legal publication. Passed June 22, 1903. Approved June 22, 1903.

CHAS. MOCHEL, President. Attest, BERT C. WHITE, Village Clerk. The following ordinance designating Main street as a business street was passed:

Be it ordained by the president and board of trustees of the village of Downers Grove, that Main street in said village, from the north line of Warren avenue to the north line of Maple avenue, be and the same is hereby designated as a business street.

Passed June 22, 1903. Approved June 22, 1903.

CHAS. MOCHEL, President. Attest, BERT C. WHITE, Village Clerk. Bids for the construction of the Main street 10 inch sanitary sewer were read as follows: Chicago Drainage Construction Co., \$1106; Michael Doran, \$967.50; Jas. W. Barker, \$751; C. T. Bartlett, \$719.70; Alex. McNeal, \$645.50. The bids of McNeal and Doran were not considered because they did not comply with the stipulations of the call for bids in that they were not accompanied by certified checks of \$100.

The bid of C. T. Bartlett of Evanston, was accepted and the street and alley committee was authorized to make contract with him after determining his responsibility.

Policeman Martin White was authorized to enforce the ordinance requiring the payment of dog tax and to make collection of the license fee.

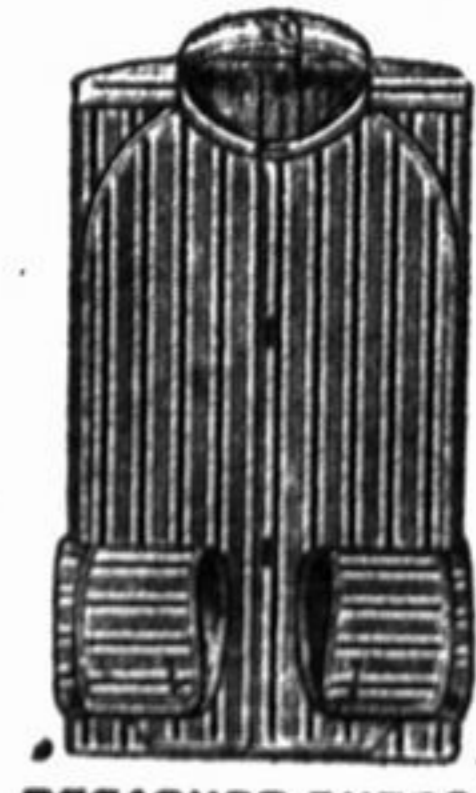
