Pontiff Passes Away Surrounded by Church Officials.

UTTERS PARTING BENEDICTIO

Last Words Were Blessings for the Cardinals and His Relatives Who Knelt About Him-Death Is Calm and Serene.

Pope Leo XIII died at 4:04 o'clock p. m., July 20. His long battle against disease had been watched throughout the world with sympathetic admiration. It ended only after a series of tremendous efforts to conquer the weakness of his aged frame by the marvelous will power of his

The pleuropneumonia with which his holiness had been suffering since July 4 was scarcely so responsible for his death as that inevitable decay of tissue which ensues upon ninetythree years of life.

The funeral ceremonies will extend over nine days, the remains being removed to the Cathedral of St. Peter's. where they will lie in state. The ultimate resting place of the pontiff will be in the magnificent basilica of St. John the Lateran.

Dies Uttering Blessing. Pope Leo's final moments were

marked by that same serenity and devotion, and when he was conscious by that calm intelligence which is assoclated with his twenty-five years' pontificate. His was no easy death. An



hour before he died, turning to Dr. Lapponi and his devoted valet. Plo Centra, he murmured: "The pain suffer is most terrible." Yet his part ing words were not of the physical anguish that he suffered, but were whispered benedictions upon the cardinals and his nephews who knett at the bedside.

The last look of his almost sightless eyes was toward the great ivory crucifix hanging in the death chamber.

Practically all the cardinals in Rome, kneeling at the bedaide, watched the passage of his soul. Earlier in the day Cardinal Serafino Vannutelli had impressively propounced the absolution in articulo mortis.

The condition of his holiness in the last hours varied from agony to coma. Wishing to relieve him, Dr. Mazzoni suggested that morphine he administered, but Dr. Lappont did not agree. fearing that the end might be quick

Doctor Describes Death. Of this supreme moment Dr. Lap-

pont gives an impressive description: "Death occurred through exhaustion," said Dr. Lapponi, "although in the last two hours Pope Leo made a supreme effort to gather together all his energies. He succeeded in recognizing those about him by the sound of their voices, as his sight was at most entirely lost. Still he made a marvelous display of his energy and even his death was really grand. It was resigned, calm and dignified.

"Very few examples can be given of a man of such advanced age after so exhaustive an illness showing such supreme courage in dying. The pontiff's last breath was taken exactly at four minutes past four. I approached a lighted candle to his mouth three times, according to the traditional ceremonies, and afterward declared the Pope to be no more.

"I then went to inform Cardinal Oreglia, the dean of the sacred col lege, who immediately assumed full power and gave orders that the Vati can be cleared of all curious persons having no right to be therein.

"Contemporaneously the cardinal instructed Monsignere Righi, master of ceremonies, to send the Swiss guards from the Clementine hall to close all the entrances to the Vatican and dismiss all persons from the death chamber, the body being intrusted to the Franciscan penitentiaries."
