Glen Eilyn Boy Drowned

Harry Keyes Loses His Life While Playing on a Raft in the Lake.

Playmates of Harlem Boy Practice Hanging—Child Burns to Death in Absence of Family—Other County News From Exchanges.

While playing on a raft in a pond at Glen Eilyn Sunday afternoon Harry Keyes, 14 years old, of Austin, fell into the water and was drowned in sight of his older brother, Walter, and three other boys who were on the raft with him.

Tuesday evening Officer Nicholson of Hinsdale picked up two polish runaway lads of nine and ten years. Upon being questioned they said that they lived on 17th street, Chicago, and that their mothers had sent them out to Downers Grove to get a job on a farm.

A melodrama that was staged by boys on the banks of the DesPlaines river Monday, almost cost the life of Otto Kahn, 13 years old, of Harlem. Young Kahn and a number of boys attended a theatrical performance some time ago, and when the fish refused to bite they put their lines aside and began reproducing the play as best they could.

In a fire which occurred on a farm occupied by Edward Thompson and family near Hampshire last week, one child was burned to death, another was probably fatally injured, and two others barely escaped with their lives.
