

SIDEWALK ORDINANCE NO. 89 N ORDINANCE for a sidewalk in village of Downers Grove, DuPag

county and state of lilinois. He it ordained by the president as board of trustees of the village of Do ners Grove, DuPage county, Illinois:

Section 1. That a sidewalk be con structed in said village on the sout side of Gilbert avenue immediately in front of the fellowing described lots or parcels of land: Part of lot 57 Asses sor's sub-division, in said village, be ing land owned by E. Wootton, and that the whole cost thereof be paid by a special tax to be levied upon such lots or parcels of land, in proportion to their frontage upon such sidewalk, in accordance with the statute in such case made and provided.

Sec. 2. Said side walk shall be 4 feet 8 inches wide and constructed of ce ment. Said cement sidewalk shall be constructed of material and in the manner hereinafter provided. Foundations for said coment sidewalk shall be prepared by bringing the space to b occupied by the sidewalk to a grade 12 inches below the established grade givon herein. When necessary, the subfoundation must be consolidated by wetting and ramming to give the proper solidity. Soft and spongy ground or grass or vegetable matter or sod must be dug out and the place refilled with solid material. Upon the subgrade, 12 inches below the established grade, shall be placed a foundation of cinders. Said foundation shall not less than 7 inches thick and 4 feet 8 inthat purpose. Upon said foundation ed. of cinders as aforesaid, the surface of which foundation of cinders shall be 5 inches below the finished grade or the grade as herein stipulated, there shall as required by law. be laid a layer of cement concrete 4 inches thick and 4 feet 8 inches wide throughout the entire length of said sidewalk upon the lines as above specified. Said concrete shall be composed of one part of Alpha Portland cement or other Portland cement equally as good, three parts of torpedo grayel and five parts of broken limestone, by volume which shall be carefully measured; said material shall then be thoroughly mixed dry by being turned with shevels twice while in a dry state. After the addition of the necessary amount of water, which shall be sprayed upon said material, the mixture shall be again turned twice with shovels before being spread upon the foundation. After being spread it shall be rammed until free mortar appears on the surface. On this concrete before it shall have time to set, shall be placed a wearing surface one inch thick, composed of one part Alpha Portland cement, or other Portland cement equally as good, and one part clean Torpedo sand, This top layer shall be flooded perfectly smooth on the upper surface and to a true plane

All of said sidewalk shall be laid sections 5 feet wide each for the width of the walk, each section to entirely separate from the adjoining sections, to the whole depth of the concrete. The joints shall be smooth, straight and plumb throughout their depth and at right angles to the line

CEMENT, -All coment shall be Alpha Portland cement, or other Portland cement equally as good, and shall be su ject to the inspection and approval a the president and street and alley committee of the board of trustees.

SAND, -All sand and gravel used in concrete and in the top surface of the walk shall be a clean Torpedo sand, free from gray, foreign or earthy matter of any kind.

STONE, -All broken stone shall be o hard limestone, broken to a uniform size so as to pass through a ring onehalf inch in diameter, and shall be clean and free from all particles of foreign material.

Side Filling.—On each side of the walk, after it shall have been built and the cement properly hardened, clean earth shall be banked up against the walk, level with the top thereof, extending two feet beyond its sides an sloping downward in the ratio of one half horizontal to one vertical, unti the natural surface of the ground is reached; this filling to be carefully smoothed off with rakes to a smooth surface. All surplus earth and material of any kind shall be removed entirely from all finished sidewalk spaces, o it shall be, if earth, er only spread in such places and in the manner as may be directed by the president and street and alley committee of the board of
