#### SIDEWALK ORDINANCE NO. 95.

AN ORDINANCE for a sidewalk in th village of Downers Grove, DuPage county and state of Illinois. Be it ordained by the president and

board of trustees of the village of Dow ners Grove, DuPage county, Illinois:

Section 1. That a sidewalk be con structed in said village on the north side of Prairie avenue immediately in front of the following described lots or parcels of land: Lots 12 and 13, block 12, Princes addition to said village and that the whole cost thereof be paid by a special tax to be levied upon such lots or parcels of land, in proportion to their frontage upon such sidewalk, in accordance with the statute in such case made and provided.

Sec. 2. Said side walk shall be 4 feet 8 inches wide and constructed of cement. Said cement sidewalk shall be constructed of material and in the manner hereinafter provided. Foundations for said cement sidewalk shall be prepared by bringing the space to be occupied by the sidewalk to a grade 12 inches below the established grade given herein. When necessary, the subfoundation must be consolidated by wetting and ramming to give the proper solidity. Soft and spongy ground or grass or vegetable matter or sod grade, 12 inches below the established grade, shall be placed a foundation of cinders. Said foundation shall not be less than 7 inches thick and 4 feet 8 inches wide after being flooded and thoroughly rammed with tools made for that purpose. Upon said foundation of cinders as aforesaid, the surface of which foundation of cinders shall be 5 inches below the finished grade or the grade as herein stipulated, there shall be faid a layer of cement concrete 4 inches thick and 4 feet 8 inches wide throughout the entire length of said sidewalk upon the lines as above speci fled. Said concrete shall be composed of one part of Alpha Portland cement or other Portland cement equally as good, three parts of torpedo grayel and five parts of broken limestone, by voltime which shall be carefully measured; said material shall then be thoroughly mixed dry by being turned with shovels addition of the necessary amount of water, which shall be sprayed upon said face one inch thick, composed of one frontage upon such said sidewalk, in Portland cement equally as good, and made and provided. one part clean Torpedo sand. Sec. 5. The village collector in hereby designated as the officer to collect the special tax herein provided for and to whom the bills or warrants for the same shall be given for collection, in accordance with the statute in such case made and provided.

Sec. 6. The village clerk shall comply with the provisions of "An act to provide additional means for the construction sidewalks in cities, towns or villages, approved April 15, 1875, and in force July 1, 1875," in accordance with which said statute this ordinance is passed; and if any land is delinquent after the return of the warrant of collection of said special tax by the said village collector to the said clerk, then said clerk shall make report of all such special tax in writing to the county treasurer and ex-officio county collector of DuPage county, state of Illinois prior to April 1, 1904, as required by said act; said county treasurer and ex-officio act; said county treasurer and ex-officie county collector shall then have full autherity to collect the same, as provided by

Sec. 7. All ordinances or parts of orsections 5 feet wide each for the full sidewalk shall be prepared by bringing dinances in conflict with or contrary to any of the provisions of this ordinance sec. 8.
