Hall came to Washington from Aurora and was given a place in the census office as clerk on the recommendation of Representative, now Sena-

tor, Hopkins. When the force was reduced he was transferred to the department of commerce and labor. A telegram was sent to Senator Hopkins informing him of the tragedy, and the body will be sent to Aurora.

Leaves Candy for Woman. Hall had planned to attend a meeting of the Mystic Circle with a young woman of Georgetown at 7 o'clock, and on a table in his room was found

a box of candy addressed in her name. Hall was unmarried and had no relatives in Washington. Some years ago he sustained serious injuries in a railway wreck in Illinois, and these, in addition to his sickness, caused him considerable pain.

On a table in the center of the room the police found a bit of paper on which was scrawled, "Notify Senator Hopkins."
