SIDEWALK ORDINANCE NO. 103.

AN ORDINANCE for a sidewalk in the village of Downers Grove, DuPage county and state of Illinois.

Be it ordained by the president and board of trustees of the village of Downers Grove, DuPage county, Illinois:

Section 1. That a sidewalk be constructed in said village on the north side of Maple avenue immediately in front of the following described lots or parcels of land:

Sec. 2. Said sidewalk shall be 4 feet 8 inches wide and constructed of cement. Said cement sidewalk shall be constructed of material and in the manner hereinafter provided.

Sec. 3. All owners of lots or parcels of land aforesaid, are hereby required to construct the sidewalk in front of their respective land aforesaid within forty days after the publishing of this ordinance.

Sec. 4. The street and alley committee of the board of trustees of the said village of Downers Grove shall certify to the bill of the costs of such sidewalk when constructed by said village.

Sec. 5. The village collector is hereby designated as the officer to collect the special tax herein provided for and to whom the bills or warrants for the same shall be given for collection.

Sec. 6. The village clerk shall comply with the provisions of "An Act to provide additional means for the construction of sidewalks in cities, towns and villages, approved April 15th, 1875, and in force July 1st, 1875."

Sec. 7. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with or contrary to any of the provisions of this ordinance, are each and all of them hereby repealed.

Sec. 8. This ordinance shall be in force from and after its passage, approval and publication in the manner as required by law.

SIDEWALK ORDINANCE NO. 104.

AN ORDINANCE for a sidewalk in the village of Downers Grove, DuPage county, and state of Illinois.

Be it ordained by the president and board of trustees of the village of Downers Grove, DuPage county, Illinois:

Section 1. That a sidewalk be constructed in said village on the west side of Lyman avenue immediately in front of the following described lots or parcels of land:

Sec. 2. Said sidewalk shall be 4 feet 8 inches wide and constructed of cement. Said cement sidewalk shall be constructed of materials and in the manner hereinafter provided.

Sec. 3. All owners of lots or parcels of land aforesaid, are hereby required to construct the sidewalk in front of their respective land aforesaid within forty days after the publishing of this ordinance.

Sec. 4. The street and alley committee of the board of trustees of the said village of Downers Grove shall certify to the bill of the costs of such sidewalk when constructed by said village.

Sec. 5. The village collector is hereby designated as the officer to collect the special tax herein provided for and to whom the bills or warrants for the same shall be given for collection.

Sec. 6. The village clerk shall comply with the provisions of "An act to provide additional means for the construction of sidewalks in cities, towns or villages, approved April 15, 1875, and in force July 1, 1875."

Sec. 7. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with or contrary to any of the provisions of this ordinance, are each and all of them hereby repealed.

Sec. 8. This ordinance shall be in force from and after its passage, approval and publication in the manner as required by law.

of the walk, each section to be entirely separate from the adjoining sections, to the whole depth of the concrete. The joints shall be smooth, straight and plumb throughout their depth and at right angles to the line of the walk.

CEMENT.—All cement shall be Alpha Portland cement, or other Portland cement equally as good, and shall be subject to the inspection and approval of the president and street and alley committee of the board of trustees.

SAND.—All sand and gravel used in the concrete and in the top surface of the walk shall be a clean Torpedo sand, free from gray, foreign or earthy matter of any kind.

STONE.—All broken stone shall be of a hard limestone, broken to a uniform size so as to pass through a ring one-half inch in diameter, and shall be clean and free from all particles of foreign material.

SIDE FILLING.—On each side of the walk, after it shall have been built and the cement properly hardened, clean earth shall be banked up against the walk, level with the top thereof, extending two feet beyond its sides and sloping downward in the ratio of one-half horizontal to one vertical.

Said sidewalk shall be built under the supervision of the president and street and alley committee of the board of trustees and built in accordance with the grade fixed by the street commissioner.

Sec. 3. All owners of lots or parcels of land aforesaid, are hereby required to construct the sidewalk in front of their respective land aforesaid, within forty days after the publishing of this ordinance.

Sec. 4. The street and alley committee of the board of trustees of said village of Downers Grove shall certify to the bill of the costs of such sidewalk, when constructed by said village, as aforesaid, showing in separate items the cost of grading, materials, construction and supervision and file it in the office of the village clerk.

Sec. 5. The village collector is hereby designated as the officer to collect the special tax herein provided for and to whom the bills or warrants for the same shall be given for collection.

Sec. 6. The village clerk shall comply with the provisions of "An act to provide additional means for the construction of sidewalks in cities, towns or villages, approved April 15, 1875, and in force July 1, 1875."

Sec. 7. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with or contrary to any of the provisions of this ordinance, are each and all of them hereby repealed.
