Albert Jones was the man charged with stealing golf clubs and balls at the Elmhurst golf club house. Jones is a colored man and plead not guilty to the charge. He claimed that he had purchased the golf outfit from a gentleman who had gone to Porto Rico. The value of the property stolen was estimated at \$75. The case was tried by jury on Tuesday and Jones was given a penitentiary sentence.
