The former is capable of making a very e'aborate and attractive exhibit, should the space allotted permit day illumination. At any rate it will show different styles of wiring-exposed and conduct-concealed lamps, roof effects, etc An exhibit of photographs is in preparation showing buildings and laboratory views of methods of instruction which will be of insterest to the public.
