Conrad Buschman of Laco has announced his candidacy for re-nomination to the collectorship of Downers Grove township, in which position he is now serving his first term. Mr. Buschman is conducting the office in a businesslike manner and is deserving of a second term. There are no other candidates for the position; in fact precedent has always conceded two terms to the collector and his nomination is practically assured.

It is with pleasure that the REPORTER is able to announce authoritatively that Representative Guy L. Bush of Downers Grove will be a candidate for re-nomination to the lower house of the general assembly before the republican senatorial convention, and will ask the support of his friends in this district. Representative Bush has served two terms in the legislature and has made an enviable record. He has always been recognized as one of the leaders on the republican side of the house and it is due to his efforts that much desirable legislation has been enacted.

The time for the annual township primaries is near at hand. The terms of James McClintock, supervisor; Conrad Buschman, collector; Frank A. Rogers, assessor; Nelson Webster, clerk and J. P. Mohr, commissioner of highways, expire at this time and these are the offices for which nominations will be made. It is understood that all the above officers will again be candidates for those positions, and as no opposition has developed they will probably be named as the nominees. All have good records as careful and efficient officers and deserve the support of the voters.

The sixteenth judicial district is composed of the counties of DuPage, DeKalb, Kane and Kendall. This district is entitled to three judges. Kane county being the largest and having more votes in the convention than DuPage, DeKalb and Kendall, may "take the bull by the horns" and nominate a Kane county man, which will give them two of the three judges. Should they decide to do this there is no reason why at the next general election they should not take all three. Heretofore, or for the past two judicial elections, there has been perfect harmony; the judges were distributed one in three counties. This is as it should be, and everyone was satisfied with the possible exception of a few disgruntled attorneys in Kane who wanted the office. Mazzini Stusser of DuPage county is a candidate. He is a good lawyer, an honorable gentleman and will go into the convention with the solid delegation of DuPage county. He is well and favorably known in the other counties in the district, and there is a strong possibility that there are enough voters in Kane county who believe in fair play and will oppose the desire of certain attorneys to gobble up the office which in all fairness belongs to DuPage county.—Journal.

On motion Dr. Vanderhoof was allowed \$10 for medical assistance in a surgical operation at the county farm. On motion John Hix and Thos. Stafford were appointed judges of election for the second district of Winfield precinct to fill vacancy caused by the removal of C. J. Bender and Ed Woodworth.

On motion the constitutionality of an act of the General Assembly of the state of Illinois, providing for the relief of the blind, was referred to the states' attorney for an opinion.

Moved by Supervisor Blodgett that a committee of five be appointed by the chair to fix upon a date of meeting and to invite the old soldiers of the county to inspect the work done in their memory by the board of supervisors. Motion declared carried. The committee appointed by the chair is as follows: Supervisors Blodgett, Hamerschmidt, McClintock, Bartlett and Churchill. On motion of Supervisor Blodgett, Supervisor Betts was added to the committee and was made chairman of same.

On motion board adjourned to March 12.

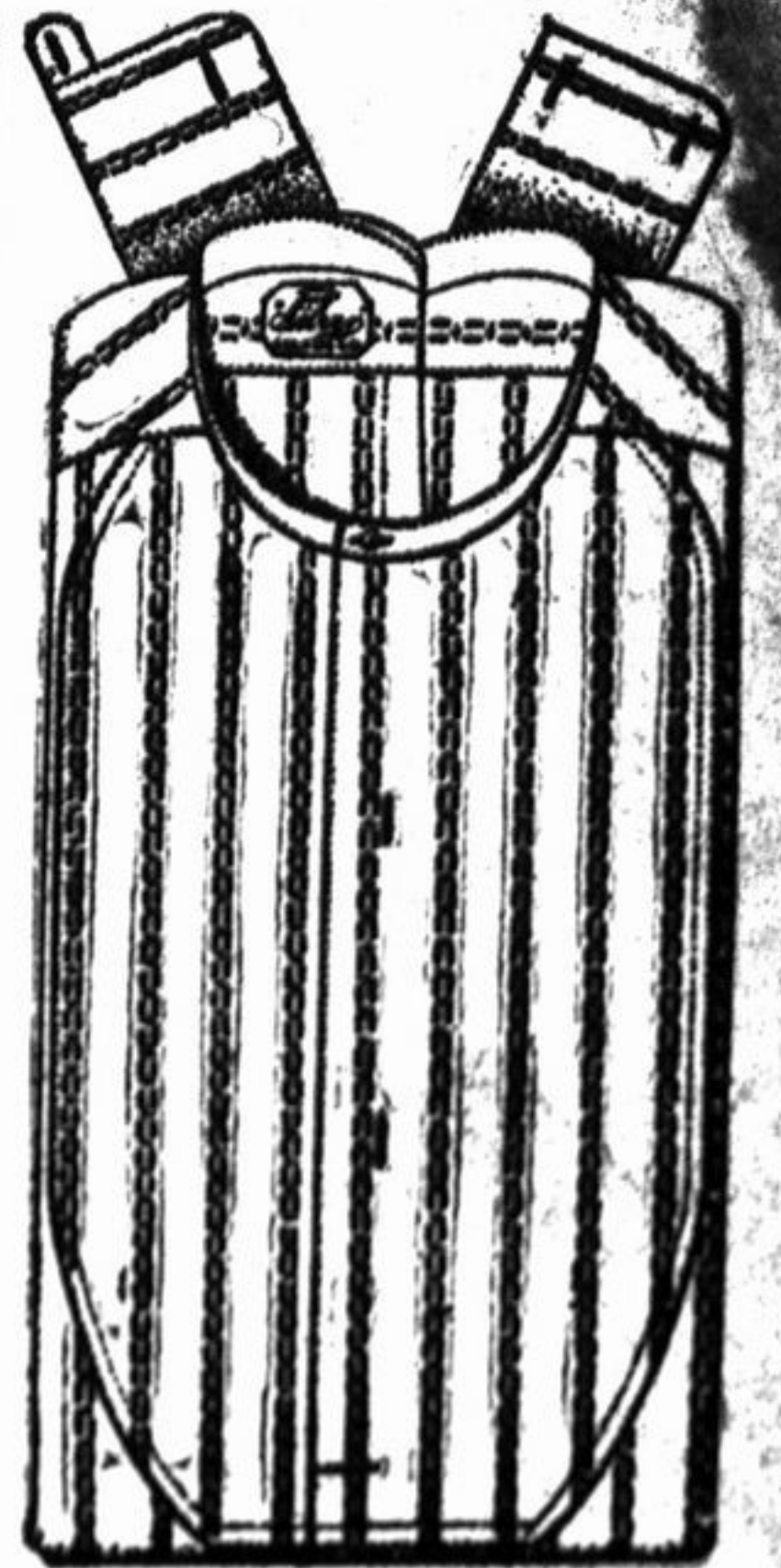
