## DO NOT BREAK IN THE LAUNDRY

Naperville missed city delivery service by \$18.78. The requirement is gross receipts of \$10,000 or more and Naperville had \$9,981.23 to her credit for the year ending June 30, 1903.

The March term of the circuit court opened on Monday and it is expected Judge Willis will preside. The grand jury will report for duty on that date. The law and chancery cases on the docket for trial are less than for a number of years.

Aurora's street car robbers, the Conway brothers, have plead guilty and Judge Willis has sentenced them for an undetermined time to the penitentiary. They plead guilty but absolutely refused to make any statement as to their crime, and will not disclose the identity of the other man with them, who was shot by officer Gibson.

Mrs. Susan Fish, the aged mother of Samuel Fish of Hinsdale, died on Monday night at nine o'clock, at the advanced age of 89 years. She was an old settler having located here about 26 years ago, coming from Massachusetts. She leaves two children, Samuel Fish of that place, and Mrs. G. Pierce of Hartford, Conn. Funeral services were held at the house Wednesday at 2:30 p. m. The burial was near Greenfield, Massachusetts.

Duane Polley, aged 10 years, who was injured in the accident near Carey on Jan. 29, died on Saturday from his injuries. In the same accident his father mother and sister were killed; Duane and a brother having been in St. Luke's hospital, Elgin, since that time for treatment. The remains were brought to the home of L. C. Stover on Monday and the funeral held on Wednesday, the remains being interred beside those of his parents. Presiding Elder Fay and Rev. Wood officiated. This is the seventh funeral from the Stover home within ten years.

In the near future DuPage county will be the scene of the first damage suit resulting from death on the third rail. Heirs of Louis Remking, who was electrocuted last July while in the company's employ, have begun a damage suit for \$10,000. On the day of his death Remking was working on the section between the two dead rails. While engaged in pulling out ties with a shovel his foreman ordered him to use a pickax, and while thus engaged he fell over backwards onto the third rail. Death was almost instantaneous. His heirs have retained Botsford, Wayne & Botsford.

Batavia has the honor of having the oldest member of the Knights of Pythias in the state of Illinois, and one of the oldest in the United States, in "Dad" Horning of that city. He was a charter member of Mercantile lodge, No. 57, situated in the city of Philadelphia in 1886, four years after the inception of the order in Baltimore. He was a charter member of Anchor lodge No. 120, of Morrison, Ill., and also a charter member of Rowena lodge No. 535, of Batavia. Mr. Horning is 68 years of age and never misses a meeting of the lodge if it is possible for him to attend, and has on many occasions driven 15 miles to attend his favorite lodge.

When the fight was on for a gas franchise for Wheaton those on the inside knew that whichever one got Wheaton would get Elmhurst, the latter having granted a 35-year franchise to the Harry W. Darling Co. In the council proceedings of Elmhurst of Feb. 20 we notice that through attorney Schryver the gas ordinance of that village was assigned from Harry W. Darling to the LaGrange Gas Co. The life of the franchise was changed from 35 to 40 years and the compensation to the city made 3 per cent for the full period. Mr. Copley will now undoubtedly run a trunk line from Hinsdale to Elmhurst and supply Lombard and Glen Ellyn on his route to Wheaton if these two towns want gas.

Charley Gentner, a shoemaker who has resided at Glen Ellyn for 30 years or more was taken to the county jail Sunday, charged with incendiarism. He is accused of setting fire to the Newton residence at Glen Ellyn a few months ago and a few days ago he attempted to burn the W. H. Luther home. Tools were found in his possession with which he bored holes in the houses and poured oil into them, igniting the wood when sufficiently saturated. Gentner was sent to Elgin about three years ago having been adjudged insane but was later discharged from the asylum. He had a grudge against Messrs. Luther and Newton which is assigned as the cause of his action. If the charge against Gentner is proven, Joliet will be his future dwelling place.

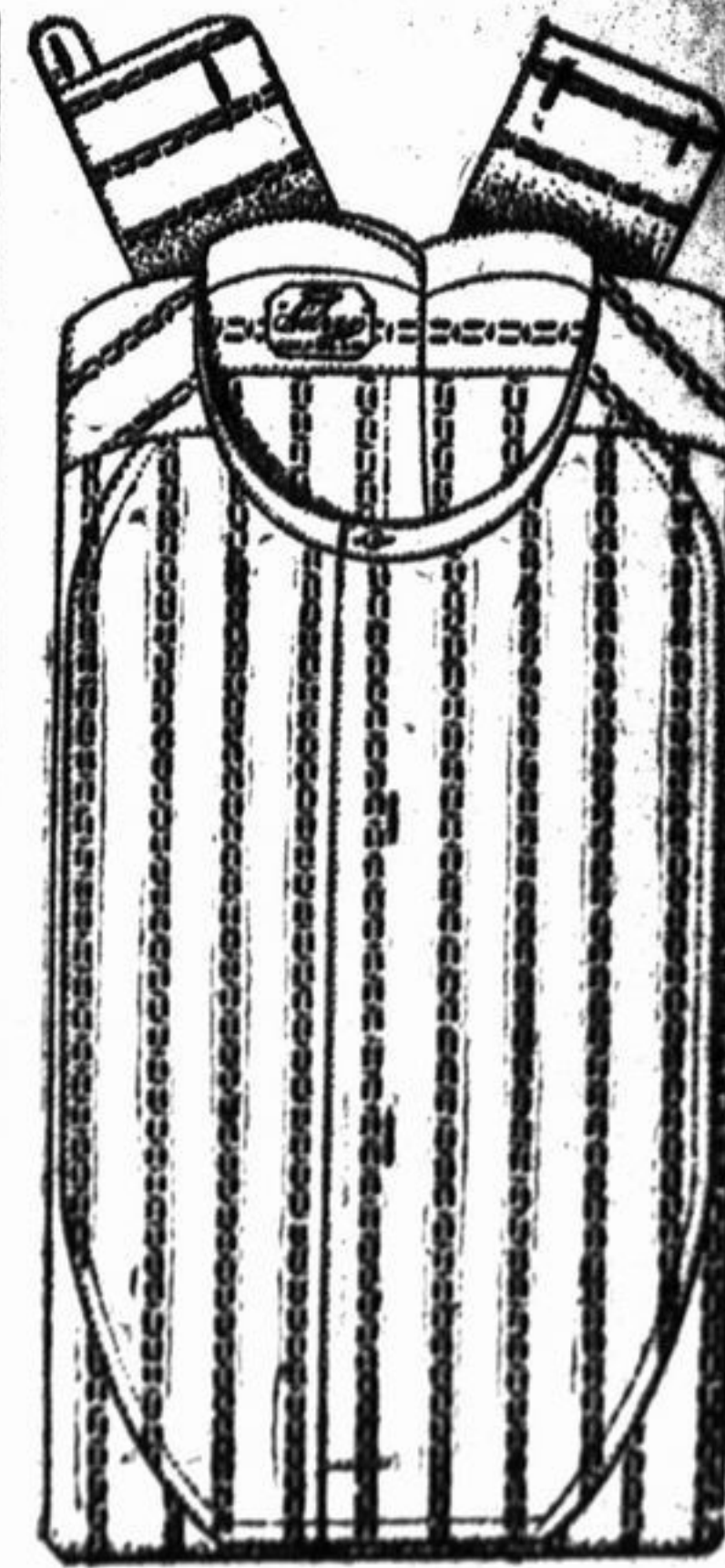
