### HOPE TO NOO THE JUDGESHIP.

The Aurora News, in an article on the circuit judgeship, says that Judge R. P. Goodwin's acceptance of the office of assistant attorney general for the postoffice department, indirectly will have a very very happy effect upon the political situation in Aurora. There are three judges in the circuit of which Aurora is a part. Heretofore a combination has existed in the circuit between DuPage county, the north end of Kane county and DeKalb county. Whereby Judge Brown of DuPage, Judge Willis of Elgin and Judge Bishop of DeKalb held judgeships. While this combination existed it was impossible for any Aurora man to obtain a circuit judgeship. After the resignation of Judge Brown of DuPage the sentiment of the Aurora bar, the Elgin bar, the bar of Kane county and the entire bar of DeKalb county was in favor of the election of Attorney J. C. Murphy of Aurora to fill the vacancy caused by the resignation of Judge Brown. This sentiment on the part of the bar was so strong that it turned the sentiment of the north end of Kane county and of DeKalb county in favor of the judgeship coming to Aurora instead of to DuPage county. With the contest, however, in Aurora between Attorneys Goodwin and Murphy for the office DuPage county succeeded in again establishing the old combination between DuPage county, the north end of Kane county and DeKalb county, and the election of Judge Ruth of DuPage county then seemed almost certain. When it became known that Judge Goodwin had withdrawn and Aurora had united for Attorney Murphy the sentiment of the circuit became again in favor of Aurora. DuPage county's fight for the judgeship is led by Judge Brown of DuPage county, who was one of the strongest politicians in the circuit. DuPage county has realized from the beginning that with a contest over the judgeship in Aurora, DuPage county was practically certain of winning the office. Without a contest in Aurora there was an equally practical certainty of the office coming to this city.

The DeKalb county politicians also are making every effort in their power to get up a contest in Aurora over the judgeship. If they can accomplish this object they will then succeed in defeating both Aurora candidates and nominating Judge Ruth of DuPage county. The politicians of Aurora will hardly permit the DuPage county politicians to bring about a contest in Aurora over this office, which could have for its only object and aim the defeat of both Aurora candidates and permitting the office, which properly belongs to Aurora, to go to DuPage county.

If the DuPage county politicians are not successful in creating a contest in Aurora and we act as a united republican party, Aurora for the first time in its history will get a circuit judgeship.

Attorney Murphy is peculiarly fitted for the office, which ought to come to Aurora. He started in as a mechanic in the employ of the Burlington road, but, by years of hard work, has risen to the front rank among all the able lawyers of our circuit. When the bar wanted to choose one of their number to fill the vacant judgeship he became practically the unanimous choice of all the lawyers throughout the entire circuit, with the exception of DuPage county, which has its own candidate. With the support of the republicans in Aurora he is practically assured of the office and Aurora of the circuit judgeship.

### FAVORABLE WEEK FOR CROPS.

The week has been the most favorable of the season for farming operations and plant growth. Under the influence of bright sunshine and warm rains vegetation made rapid growth. It is estimated that the rapid advance of the season in the last week has brought it up to the average stage. Much ground has been prepared for corn and some planting done. Plowing has progressed favorably, the soil being mellow and breaking well. Under favorable weather conditions a large acreage will be planted during the ensuing week. The outlook for oats is encouraging. The crop is practically all in the ground and in many localities the plant is showing. Wheat has greatly improved during the week, a majority of fields ranging from fair to excellent. Rye is in a thrifty stage. Meadows and pastures have improved. Gardens are mostly planted and are doing well. Early planted potatoes are up. Fruit, except peaches, is very promising. The trees are in full bloom and a heavy yield is indicated.

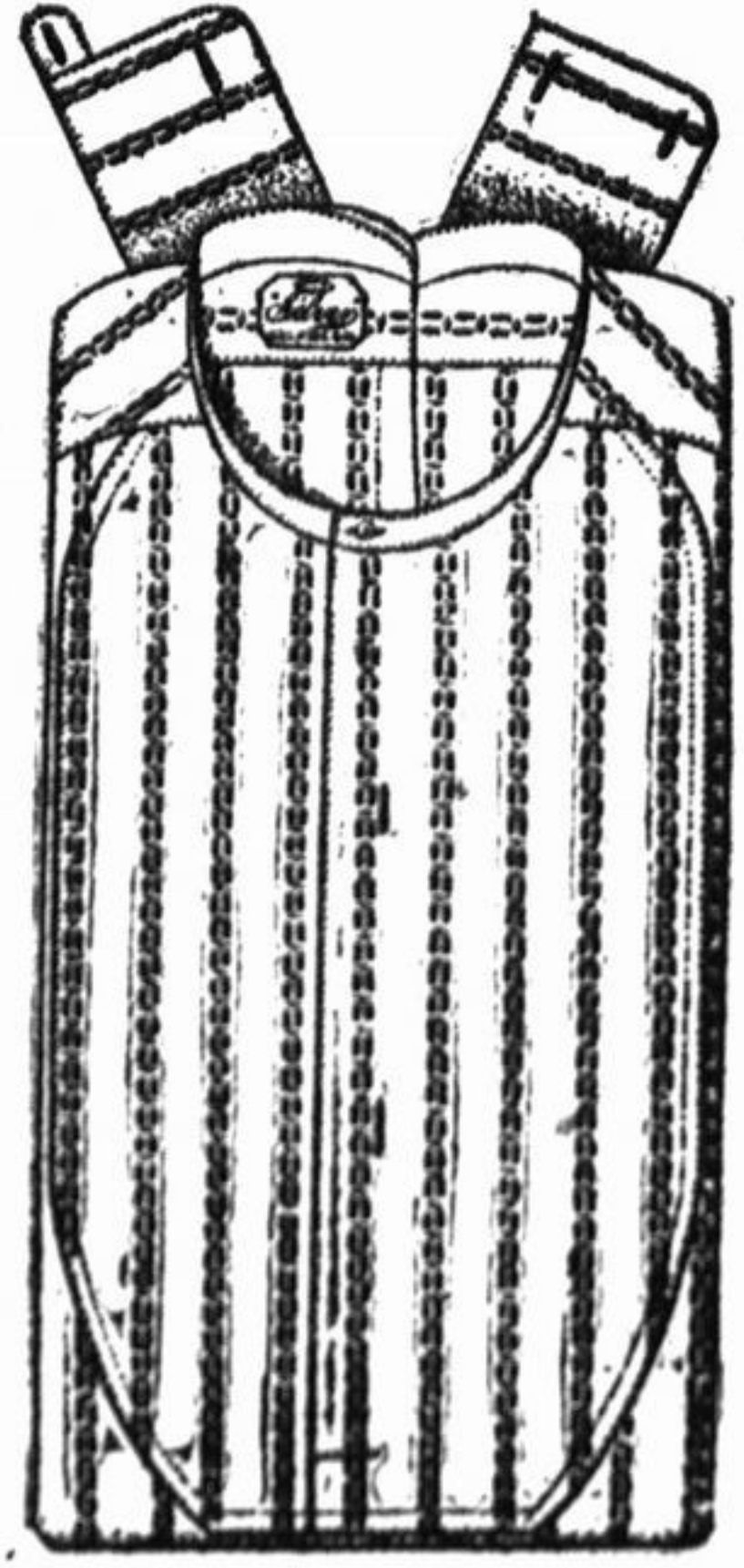
