



SENATOR QUAY DIES AFTER LONG STRUGGLE

Noted Republican Politician Passes Away at Beaver, Pa., Surrounded by His Family.

Beaver, Pa., dispatch: Senator Matthew Stanley Quay died at 2:48 o'clock Saturday afternoon. The end was peaceful and when death came he was surrounded by the members of his family.

The immediate cause of Senator Quay's death was exhaustion, due to inability to assimilate nourishment. Chronic gastritis and inflammation of the stomach were the foundations of the trouble.

Senator Quay some months ago realized that his end was approaching. and, with extreme care, set about preparing for it.

Senator Quay's illness began about year ago. It was a recurrence of the trouble that beset him during the latter part of 1900 and the early days of January, 1901, when he was undergoing the strain of a desperate fight for re-election to the senate.

He celebrated his seventieth birthday at Beaver last fall, and at the time seemed in excellent health. The loss of weight, however, was constantly on his mind. He forsook his duties in the United States senate and betook himself to Florida, hoping that the mild weather there would bring relief. Florida failed to restore vital

The senator went back to Washing ton and soon after was taken to Philadelphia, where he was placed under treatment of Drs. White and Stengel. two eminent specialists of that city They ordered him to Atlantic City hoping the sea air would ald in recov ery, but the loss continued.

The relapse which alarmed the fan ily on Sunday, May 22, recurred again Thursday night, and the alarm was so serious that the Pittsburg specialists were called in at midnight.

On Friday he rallied again, and was able to converse with former Senator J. Donald Cameron for a time. Senator Quay had sent for Cameron, but never told anybody what he wanted. That same night the absent members of the family were summoned and every preparation for the end made.

PRESBYTERIANS ARE TO UNITE

Merger Proposition Meets With Favor in the Buffalo Convention.

Buffalo, N. Y., special: By an overwhelming viva voce vote the general assembly of the Presbyterian church in the United States adopted the report of the committee on union with the Cumberland Presbyterian church. The resolutions adopted include not only favorable action on the report. but recommended certain other steps to be taken to secure the uplon of the churches and to make plain the position of the church. The question of proposed basis of union will now go to the presbyteries of the general assembly. If it is approved by a vote of two-thirds of them, the necessary steps will be taken at the next general assembly to effect the union. The announcement of the result was received with great cheering.

OLD BIBLE HIDES A FORTUNE

Widow Discovers \$1,000 Placed There Thirty Years Ago.

Shelbyville, Ind., dispatch: Mrs. John Wheeler found \$1,000 of old money hidden in an old family bible that was hidden away by her busband thirty four years ago. When John Wheeler, a young farmer of this county, was married, thirty-four years ago, he had saved \$1,000. On his wedding day he told his wife that he would put the money away until they needed it. The husband died a year ago. Mrs. Wheeler had hunted for for the money, but failed to find it.


