WEEKLY CROP BULLETIN.

Well distributed showers and mean temperature above the seasonal average have contributed to rapid and vigorous plant growth during the past week. While Look over the latest effects in hand the soil is too wet for farming operations some wall paper and interior decora- in portions of the southern district, and tions at Krambs & Mertz, 33 South planting has been retarded, elsewhere it is generally in fine condition. The showers have been mostly "farmers' rains," occurring in the night, and have not materially bindered work in the field. Corn in the northern district is uniformly promising. It is showing a good stand and considerable cultivating has been done. In the central and southern districts the condition is not so even. Planting is still in progress but the work is well advanced. In all sections much replanting has been done on account of had seed and the ravages of cutworms. Oats have been greatly improved by the warm rains. In the central and southern districts complaint is made of the thin stand in some localities, but the average condition is good. Wheat is heading in the southern half of the state. Although some fields are poor and will give a greatly reduced yield the general condition is quite favorable. The outlook for rye is promising. Meadows and pastures have made rapid growth under very favorable conditions. Some clover is now in bloom. Stock continues healthy but the young pig crop is small. Gardens have made advance and potatoes are showing well, except in portions of the southern district where much seed rotted in the ground. Strawberries are in bloom in the northern district and ripe in the southern. A heavy yield is indicated. Apples gave promise of a heavy output, but many unfavorable reports have been received that the fruit is dropping at such a rate as to cause a greatly reduced yield.


