QUAINT OLD FULLERSBURG

A Descriptive Story of a Suburb which Pre-dated Chicago

Dwellers amid picturesque scenery and historic spots seldom appreciate the beauty and interest that leads strangers to travel miles to behold, but one Hinsdale woman at least has found in quaint old Fullersburg something worthy of an invitation to Chicago sight seekers.

A scant mile to the northeast of Hinsdale nestles the quaint, old time hamlet known to the postal guide as Fullersburg, in popular parlance yecept Brush Hill. In picturesque valley beloved of aboriginal man and early settler nature here retains in large measure primeval charms.

modern travel, "so near and yet so far," it is doubtful if any other spot within the same radius of Chicago holds paramount attraction with this beautiful valley. In this leafy month of June the air is fragrant with wild ginseng, wild roses line the roadsides, and the broad surface of the lazy stream is bedecked with thousands of waxy white, golden-hearted pond lilies, floating on big green leaves.

Historical associations are not wanting and traditions abound. Brush Hill was a hamlet while Chicago was yet an Indian trading post. Here Father Marquette tarried on his journeyings to preach to the children of the forest. Straight through here goes the old Indian trail, afterwards the planked stage road, now Ogden avenue, which started at the site of the old Bull's Head tavern at the joining of Ogden avenue and Madison street in Chicago, and connecting with the outlying settlements.

For the route to this happy valley our party may come by trolley or by rail, or on their wheels. If the trolley is chosen plan for an early start; take the Metropolitan Elevated to Fifty second avenue, then the Suburban Electric to La Grange, where one can hire a "rig" at the livery for the remaining distance, or take the train to Hinsdale, walking thence to Fullersburg. Or one may go by train on the Chicago, Burlington & Quincy railroad directly to Hinsdale.
