DR. T. F. LEECH'S CHESS CODE.

Dr. T. F. Leech of this place has a world-wide reputation as a chess player and chess problem solver. He has played games with some of the best chess players in America and has been in several tournaments.

DESCRIPTION OF THE LEECH CHESS NOTATION.

The chessmen move on four different lines, numbered from right to left. The bishop moves on lines numbered (1) and (3); the line running upward to the right being No. 1, the line running upward to the left, No. 3.

When to Hunt. You can hunt and kill quail with gun only between Nov. 10 and Dec. 20 of each year.

You must not kill any prairie chicken or grouse for a period of four years from the 1st of July, 1903.

You can kill woodcock and mourning doves only between Aug. 1 and Dec. 31 of each year.

You can kill gray, red, fox or black squirrels only between July 1 and Dec. 31 of each year.

You can kill all kinds of snipe and plover only between Sept. 1 and May 1 of each succeeding year.

You can kill wild geese, ducks and bustard and other water fowl only between Sept. 1 and April 15 of each succeeding year.
