#### DR. T. F. LEECH'S CHESS CODE.

Dr. T. F. Leech of this place has a world-wide reputation as a chess player and chess problem solver. He has played games with some of the best chess players in America and has been in several tourneys. Chess is a very difficult game to inform the public about correctly. The time-worn plan has been to use letters and figures to represent the chessmen and the moves. Frequently the printers get the letters and figures transposed and in doing so the whole solution would be thrown out of order and the reader would be unable to follow the game. Dr. Leech has devised, after working on the problem for the past fifteen years or so, a code of words to represent the pieces on the chess board and their possible moves. Below we give the code and the explanation, so that a chess player can easily understand it. It would be well to preserve this code to play games with till the words are learned:

DESCRIPTION OF THE LEECH CHESS NOTATION.

The chessmen move on four different lines, numbered from right to left. The bishop moves on lines numbered (1) and (3); the line running upward to the right being No. 1, the line running upward to the left, No. 3. The rook moves on lines No. 2 and No. 4, the perpendicular line (or file) is No. 2. The one running laterally (crosswise of the board) is No.

4. The K and Q move on all four lines, the I's on three. These lines are represented by four columns of words on the Code, numbered from left to right.

A piece may move seven squares on any line.

The first letter of a word, giving a move, designates the piece moved---, king; d, dame (queen); r, rook; b, bishop; s, skipper (knight); p, pawn. The moves in the columns are numbered from the top downward.

All the moves of the queen's pieces and pawns are on the left half of the Code, while those of the king are on left lower part of the Code. All the pawns, while they remain on their own file or are doubled, re-

tain their name. The knights' moves are on four lines, and numbered 1 and 2, on each line,

No. 1 being next to the player. The line below to the right is No. 1; the one above the right is No. 2; the one below to the left is No. 3; and the one above to the left is No. 4. The moves of the K, Kt and P are not affected by the edge of the board.

A piece moving to an occupied square is "takes," and a P moving diagonally to a vacant square is PxP en pas. To find the move number begin at the piece and count the squares to the right (or front) first, and then in like manner those to the left (or rear) of piece. Put a mark on QB, QKt and QR.

Count the squares on a line, as if the board was clear. The squares on the chess-board are numbered from 11 to 88; by beginning at the near left hand corner square (for white) number the left hand column from 1 to 8 and the lower row of squares in like manner from 1 to 8. The

This paper published the Marshall-Lasker game and not an error occurred in the print, while the Chicago Daily News printed it and made several errors because the old code was used. Several moves were left out and the solution was so mixed up that a reader could not follow same and play the game over.
