AURORA CHAUTAUQUA ASSEMBLY
Aurora Chautauqua this year will be a Grand Affair
As a result of the many improvements that have been made at Riverview park, the grounds have undergone a transformation that will make possible information that will make possible a wonder if it is the same place. A splendid new steel auditorium has been erected by the traction company for the use of the chautauqua and will be ready

before the assembly opens. It is of the latest design with proper acoustic properties and will seat about three thousand five hundred people. The seats are on an incline of several feet which makes the platform easily visible from any portion of the building. It will be equipped with a splendid stage and seated to the full capacity with comfortable seats especially designed and made to fit. The floor will be of ten feet, three inches in thick-

ness. The grounds have been laid out by a landscape artist and buildings moved to accommodate the scheme. The capacity of the toilet accommodations has been doubled, a new well has been sunk, amusement features added and rustic beauties of the ground greatly added to. The streets of the tenting section will be amply lighted with electricity and the general lighting of the grounds improved. With these improvements the success of the chautauqua

will be greatly augmented and patrons will enjoy the assembly under conditions as favorable as those of any chautauqua in the United States.
Each season it has been the aim of the management of the Aurora chautauqua assembly to present to the people of Aurora and vicinity a program of increased merit without increased cost to them. The list of carefully selected talent bears evidence that the program excels that of any previous season. It contains the names of some who have appeared at former assemblies together with many who are new to Aurora chautauqua audiences, and this paper has the pleasure of presenting the pictures of some of those who will be present. Naperville Park will be the scene of a joyous meeting this year. The occasion will be the annual gathering of the Evangelical church people and their friends and it will be continued from August 6 to August 10. Below we reprint from the advance courier of the association:
Sunday school convention and bible institute held jointly, August 7-9; English camp meeting, August 6-12; W. M. S. rally day, August 14; German camp meeting, August 12-19.
Rev. F. C. Berger, of Flint, Mich., a preaching rider in the Michigan conference, an energetic preacher and soul winner, well known in the church as a writer and traveler, will have charge of the evangelistic work during the English camp meeting. Beginning with Wednesday evening, August 7, he is to preach every night throughout the week and Sunday morning and evening.
Bishop Theo. Bowman, D. D., senior bishop in the Evangelical association, and veteran in camp meeting work, will be the principal preacher during the German camp meeting, remaining over Sunday, August 18. We feel sure that the announcement of his coming will gratify and enthrall all who have heard this eloquent herald of the Cross in years that are past.
Prof. S. J. Giamerfelder, Ph. D., will have charge of the bible study hour each day during the first week. Presenting the subject of 'Prayer' in a series of readings.
The names of President H. J. Kiehler, Ph. D., Prof. M. E. Nommaker, A. M., Hon. William Groe, Rev. F. C. Berger and Rev. A. J. Boelter appear on the convention program.
Rev. W. A. Schutte, of Chicago, will be in charge of the German camp meeting.
Miss Alice Louise Peters, of South Chicago, will be in charge of the children's meetings which will be held daily at one thirty p. m. throughout the encampment.
Rev. G. A. Manshardt, of Naperville second church, will act as superintendent of the Sunday school held each Sabbath.
Rev. F. C. Neitz, of Naperville, will act as chorister.
Rev. J. C. Kiest, of Humboldt Park, Chicago, will be superintendent of prayer meetings at the German camp meeting.
Rev. J. S. Stamm, of Downers Grove will be superintendent of prayer meetings at the English camp meeting.
Facilities for transportation between the city of Naperville and the park will be provided at reasonable rates and at convenient hours. Regular bus trips are made between Naperville and the park. Baggage can be transferred from the railroad station at reasonable rates. All baggage must be checked to Naperville. Persons desiring attention given to baggage, as above, should write to Louis Kemmerer, Naperville, Ill. Hand baggage will be carried to and from park station by responsible boys for a small fee.
Local trains on the 'Burlington' will stop at Naperville Park station to discharge and receive passengers during the entire encampment. Ask your agent for a return ticket to Naperville park. Heretofore we have always secured reduced rates. Compensation tickets also will be honored for park travel.
