FARM FURROWS

POULTRY POINTERS.
There are 8,120 feathers in the average hen's suit.
The farmer who raises poultry can always obtain ready money.
Be careful to get eggs from the best 2-year-old layers for hatching.
Handy nests are a comfort to the hens and a great convenience to egg gatherers.

Always keep young poultry out of wet grass and never allow them to run at large when the weather is cold enough to thoroughly chill them.
Ducks and geese may be fattened very quickly on boiled turnips, potatoes and carrots thickened with oatmeal.
The care-all in the poultry yard is good management. Its principal virtue is that it is preventive.

EFFECT OF LIME AND POTASH.
I was much interested in the article by Secretary Coburn on p. 6. The uplands in south central New York cannot be considered particularly adapted to growing alfalfa.
Indeed, the attempt to grow it has been discouraged by some excellent authorities.
Yet the fact that this region is essentially a dairy district makes alfalfa very desirable.

PEAFOWL.
You seem to imply that peacocks are not good eating. Before I became a vegetarian, I have eaten peacock; it is like other birds; well-fed young ones are good, old, lean ones are poor, coarse and tough.
As in the case of plants, there are few animals that are not good to eat at some stage of their development or in some part of their anatomy.

DUST BAD FOR HOGS.
During the busy times of year the rush of work on the farm often induces carelessness regarding some of the essential things in the care of live stock.
Many cases will be found where the care of feeding hogs being left to hired help, the corn, in dry weather will be thrown continually in the same spot until the swine are compelled to root in dust for the grain.
