Timed to the nicety of a fractional second the white car passes swiftly under the red one and leaving a gap lands upon a platform prepared with heavy steel springs, thus minimizing the force of impact, the red car following closely upon the same platform.

Another thriller, more beautiful and no less startling is the act entitled "Jupiter, the Balloon Horse." This horse, ridden by Madame Raphael, takes a position on a platform, attached to the bottom of a balloon. The animal is not fastened in any way. As the balloon ascends to the great dome of the Coliseum, Jupiter, a beautiful milk white Arabian stallion, stands like a statue, with Madame Raphael on his back. Reaching the dome the balloon rests for a moment, while a battery of fireworks edging the platform is ignited, completely enveloping horse and rider in a fountain of fire. As the fire dies away the balloon with its passenger freight slowly descends to the arena.

Japan is now competing actively with the United States and Great Britain for China's trade in pianos, piano players and organs.
