At the recent conference session Rev. H. E. Straub has been appointed as pastor of this church.

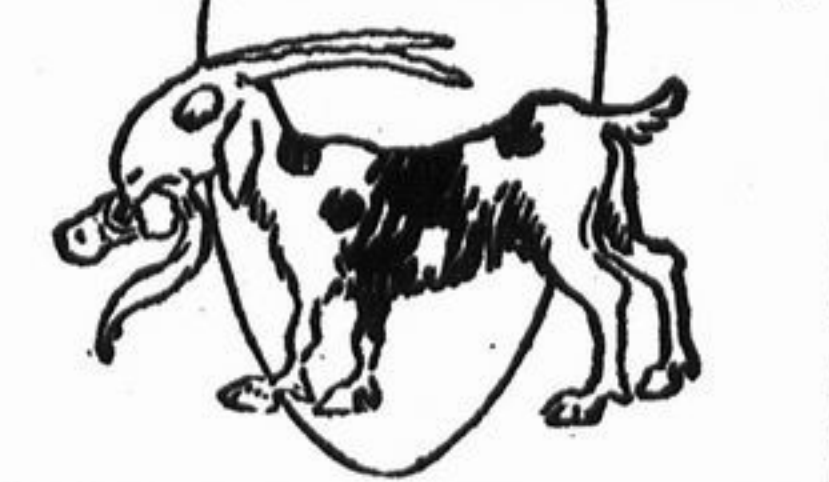

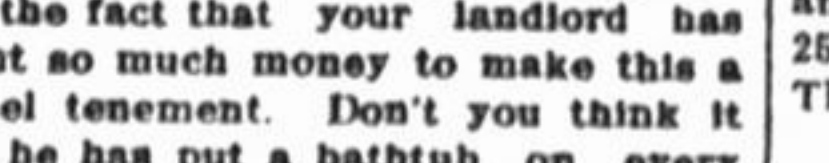
